





"The Old Year has gone. The New Year has taken possession of the clock of time. All hail the duties and possibilities of the coming twelve months!" - Edward Payson Powell



This year's Fall Color Tour was very similar to 2020 in terms of planning. Finding a cider mill and restaurant were our biggest challenges. Due to labor shortages, many restaurants and cider mills could not host us due to capacity limitation. Prices were also much higher than last year, on average costs have increased up to 40%. We spent a lot of time searching for a restaurant and park or cider mill who could accommodate us. We lucked out found Three Cedars Farm in Northville and Bravo! in Livonia to host us. Our dinner was limited to 50 people due to the restaurant's capacity, but we did not limit number of drive participants. The SEMPCA Board of Directors decided to sponsor our cider and donuts.

We started our tour at Automotive Techniques in Novi. Jeff and Dave were kind enough to let us use their facility and provided cider and bottled water for Fall Color Tour participants. There were Porsches, classic vehicles

and engines in their shop for participants to check out. We had a record turnout; 80 cars and 128 people joined our Fall Color Tour. We did not expect to have this large of turnout and had to change our plan the day before the event. We planned on five groups or leaders like in previous years, but with increase in participants we have to expand it to seven groups. Fortunately, Automotive Technique's facility and parking lot allowed us to stage all 80 cars. Thank you to Chris Bohr, Andrew Vincent, Walt/Sabrina Crump, Howard Gilson/Karen, Chrissy Crowe/Gretus Hoogestraat, Mark/Rene VanderEyk, Marc/Lisa Molzon and Jim/Laurie Williams for leading the groups and ensuring a fun and safe event.

Like every Fall Color Tour, we pray for good weather, roads and colors. The weather prediction was bleak with heavy rain, but that did not deter our participants. We had good mix of Porsches from older air-cooled to



I drove around in a rear wheel drive/front engine vehicle while my wife followed me in a 4x4 truck ready to pull me out if I ever got stuck. We found an area near the end of their parking lot to be the best to accommodate our group. From there, our participants were directed to a tent to enjoy excellent cider and donuts.

We went to Dexter/Hell/Pickney area for our second half of the tour. We arrived at the restaurant around 6 PM and dinner was served right after.

So, that's the summary of the 2021 Fall Color Tour and dinner. This is my fourth time planning the Fall Color Tour. With the help of Chris Bohr, the event co-chair, we managed to put together this year's tour. It is a rewarding experience as this event allows us as SEMPCA members and families to have fun and enjoy each other's company.

Also visited was the Schlumpf Bugatti Museum in France along with the BMW and Mercedes museums. Needless to say, a few beers were downed at Octoberfest in Munich.

Not only that, but ten days on a tour bus also cemented some longtime friendships with other club members.

On the way down to the Parade in the Ozarks, Jim picked up a 2004 Sapphire Blue 996 Cabriolet which he presently drives. Unfortunately, at the 2021 French Lick Parade he received minor damage to the car in a parking structure incident. After being repaired, the 996 is now good as new and possibly ready for another concours. Laurie, Jim's wife, expressed the fact that he does not have a barn anymore and now lives in a house with a two car garage or he would have more cars than the five he presently owns. The Porsche club has always felt like Jim's home. True to Jim's spirit of giving, he volunteered to be the club Treasurer in 2019. As testimony to him being held in high esteem by fellow club members, Jim was elected to the SEM Board of Directors for the 2022-23 term, an achievement for which he is to be congratulated.





Early Adopters

With the growing rate of the introduction of new technology, our society is increasingly being divided into two groups, traditionalists and early adopters. Just like it sounds, one group of people stick to tried and tested products and the other group are the first to embrace something new and cutting edge. Perhaps we have always seen those people who want to be the first to be associated with the latest and most advanced products. But, with today's new technology these early adopters seem to live more on the edge than ever. Don't assume that early adopters are any specific generation either

The automotive world has made the early adopter even more significant in the buying public. By that I am referring to those people who are jumping into the world of electric cars. In a very big way the auto manufacturers are counting on and courting the early adopters to steer the marketplace toward electric vehicles. Even though the electric vehicle comes with its own set of challenges and inconvenience, it will not deter the early adopter from being the first in his circle of friends to own one. With the environmental challenges ahead of us it is easy to see why the early adopter is important to our future and the future of the automotive industry.

You might guess that Porsche is not new to early adopters and their cars. At the age of 23 Ferdinand Porsche was working for Lohner Werke when he developed a hybrid battery driven car with a gasoline generator. The car was driven at each wheel by electric hub motors. Some 300 cars were produced between 1900 and 1905. So advanced was this concept that Boeing and NASA studied this engineering approach for the Lunar Rover. Consider what might have been if the original Porsches had used this technology in the late 1940's. Here was a totally new car company with no heritage at the end of WWII and almost nonexistent material sources. They were producing a sports car when cars were still novelties, mostly owned by the rich. Their offering was unconventional and for the most part impractical. No other car, except the lowly VW, was rear engine much less air cooled. The competition was luxury cars, mostly with custom coachwork. The sales network was almost nonexistent as were the parts and service network. They established a reputation though racing, not through outright wins but victories in lesser classes. When their model offerings reached a marketing limit they had to face a radical redesign. But they chose a conservative path of retaining the rear engine air cooled approach, still unique in the marketplace. They depended on an almost unknown North American market with a high priced offering and limited choices.

This worked for a while until government regulations nearly drove them out. Alliances with VW left them with controversial low end models that did little for the lineage and reputation. What was left of their market faced the marketing and engineering might of the Japanese who offered competitive models at competitive prices. Approaching bankruptcy plus an aging and uncompetitive production line, a radical redesign barely turned the situation around. They took another chance on redesign, but it was based on an entry level product. Only a few years later desperation hit again and they took a radical and hugely chancy market redirection toward the then infant SUV market with a high priced model again with no heritage. There is no contending that this big chance ended up saving the company. Over and over again they faced the marketplace with vehicles that challenged owners to take a chance on a model that was unique and high priced. Time and time again the buying public rose to the challenge and bailed out the little company with high priced cars that sold at the highest price and profit margins in global car manufacturing. They made crazy marketing decisions like offering special models with less content and fewer luxury features that sold out at inflated prices. Even very limited luxury models, designed almost opposite from their competition, found a steady supply of buyers.

Now little Porsche has reached another milestone of creating a deviant path for its automotive design. Electrification has become an enormous challenge even for the largest manufacturers. The investment requirements are only matched by the engineering challenges. Major car companies are searching for partners to spread out the risk, but Porsche faces this radical shift with the might of the VW monolith behind them. Their very early adopter model, the Taycan is unique in its model range as is the market that they are trying to reach. Again, with no model heritage, they challenge all comers even those who have an established electric car owner following. Will their loyal customer base follow them in this new direction? Will the engineering solutions adapt through the rest of their model line? Will they find engineering solutions to this entirely new direction in car manufacturing and will the solutions come quick enough so not to be a detriment to their reputation?

The biggest question is whether Porsche will be successful in convincing a new lineage of early adopters to take a chance on a very high priced and uniquely positioned car in a very competitive future marketplace. The future is very challenging in ways that the buying public has never faced before. New buyers of electric cars are being asked to take a big chance, accepting a radical shift in car ownership. Are you one of those early adopter buyers? Porsche is counting on it.
