







# Henry Ford Museum Recap

With Michigan's long winters getting out to a great car venue and museum makes the suffering a bit more palatable. So, on Saturday March 19th about 30 Southeast Michigan Region members ventured out of their warm homes and headed to The Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn for a visit.

One of the main draws was the "Racing to Win" exhibit that opened just a little over a year ago. Some of you may remember that the Southeast Michigan Region was given a sneak peek of this exhibit back at the November 2018 Annual Membership Dinner. Matt Anderson, the Henry Ford's Curator of Transportation, was our speaker and provided a PowerPoint tour of the future exhibit.

The event started off with the group gathering near the main entrance area of museum. Lucas Phan, the event chairman, welcomed and then thanked everyone for coming. He then turned the gathering over to Gary Ambrus for a brief history presentation concerning an event that occurred in the entrance location. On the evening of October 21,

1929, a banquet was held to honor Thomas Alva Edison and to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of his perfecting the incandescent light bulb. Three hundred of the Who's Who in 1929 were in attendance, including President Herbert Hoover, to not only honor Edison but to also dedicate the museum and village in his honor. Most visitors walk through this famous entrance not knowing its 1929 historical significance.

Upon entering the museum the group headed in many directions with the majority heading to the automotive section. The racing displays were well received with many historic vehicles on display such as the Henry Ford's Sweepstakes Racer, the 1965 Indy 500 winning Lotus-Ford and the 1967 Le Mans winning Ford GT.

Over the next several hours SEM/PCAers enjoyed wandering through this great museum taking in the magnitude of the displays.



# Munk's Motors Tech Session Recap

It snowed early on the morning of Munk's Motors' first in-person Porsche event since fall, 2019. Just a dusting, but enough to indicate it would be a cold gray day. We were concerned that might affect attendance, which it did, though not in the way we expected.

As it happened, the cold weather worked in our favor. Several drivers who had been looking forward to the first OTD of the season at Waterford Hills took one look at the thermometer plus a look at their tires and came to our tech session instead, which resulted in one of the biggest tech sessions we have ever had!

"We were excited to welcome everyone back," said Chris "Munk" Braden. "It has been two years. We have missed hosting our Porsche community and if the attendance numbers are anything to go by, they missed us as much as we missed them."

It was a great opportunity for old friends and Porsche acquaintances to catch up. Looking around, I saw the track-day/DE crowd gathered together. I saw two 924 Turbo owners comparing notes about their cars. I also saw quite a few of our usual event attendees, whom we had not seen in ages, catching up with each other in small groups. At Munk's tech sessions, we generally try to offer a wide variety of subjects— something for older cars and new, tracked cars and street, etc.—and this time was no exception. We highlighted six topics throughout the day.

First up, one of our techs demonstrated a header installation on a 911. The car's owner wanted to replace rusted parts. "This was a matter of safety," noted lead tech Rick Christian. "One of the pipes in the heater box had broken, causing exhaust fumes to leak into the car."

For the next project, Rick installed an LED headlight on a 924. The crowd compared the brightness of the LED on one side to the sealed-beam headlight on the other; the LED was brighter by an order of magnitude. "Most of the time, this can be a do-it-yourself project, but it depends on the vehicle," Rick said. "A few models require removing the bumper or the light fixture, but not the 924."

Then talk turned to the benefits of a pre-purchase inspection. The car may be clean, and pretty, but what can't you see? Rick Christian reviewed the kinds of things we look for in a PPI, the good and bad, so you know exactly what you are getting into. These include mechanical items, the suspension

and major oil leaks. For certain models, like Boxsters and early water-cooled 911s with known IMS bearing trouble,

we check an oil sample for metal particulates to assess whether there might be further damage. It is money well spent. Nobody wants to be surprised by a major repair on a new-to-them car.

After that, Rick highlighted sunroof care and repair. It's important to keep the tracks clean, make sure the drains work and that the proper lubricant is used if the system calls for it. "We have found over time, the plastic guides can break. If your car has a sunroof, you should either know how to service, clean and test the drains or take it to a service location familiar with sunroofs. Either way, you should always check your cowl drains."

Then both techs talked about Bosch fuel hose upgrades. "We have seen a lot of hoses age out as a result of damage from ethanol fuel," Braden said. "We can replace those, but really, with an older car, your best bet is to keep

a good fire extinguisher in your car. We recommend the Element 50, but anything is better than nothing."

Rick Christian wrapped up the day by going over the tools and process we use to corner balance and align a track car in the shop. Standing next to a 993 in an alignment bay, he showed the tools and how we set up, but stopped short of doing the balancing. "Corner balancing can be a tedious process, and is not much of a spectator sport!" Rick said.

Someone asked when should you corner balance and align? Rick answered, "Corner balancing is useful primarily for those who drive on track, while aligning alone is good for both the street and the track. It doesn't help that your suspension is pounded if you drive in Michigan, you know we have some nasty roads, but for better tire wear have your alignment checked annually."





## Owner's Manuals


Owner's manuals are often disrespected and ignored, lost in the clutter of a glove box or console. Owners usually fall into two categories; those who ignore the manuals and those who read them cover to cover. I am somewhere in the middle as someone who browses through for the highlights and pictures. It is a shame not to read them as they come full of useful information. Every Porsche comes with one in its own protective pouch of burgundy vinyl. I added a second leather burgundy pouch for essential papers.

My Porsche owner's manual is 103 spiral bound pages of well written descriptions, technical specifications and lots of basic instruction for routine maintenance. It even has practical guidelines on how to drive the car and operate all of the optional features. It was written specific to the 1972 – 1973 911E. A separate small book contains the maintenance record where each service operation was logged by the dealer with a stamp.

Owner's manuals date back to at least 1920. Porsche manuals started in 1952 and covered every street model from 356 to the 959 and even included the 904, of which with only 106 cars made from 1963 to 1965 making it a very rare piece. It has only 58 pages with six charts and until recently an NOS copy could still be purchased. But no worry, Porsche Classic had over 700 reprinted copies of owner's manuals and maintenance books. I mention this because there is a nasty habit for owners selling their car but retaining the manual as a souvenir. If you must retain the manual, be considerate and leave the original copy with the car and purchase a reproduction. Reproductions are big business with literally hundreds of thousands of copies available for every make, model and every year of production. But even more useful is that those same manuals are available for free in PDF format from dozens of web sites. In this era of computer housed information, owner's manuals can be referenced on the cars information

and entertainment systems. Instead of a book, the data might come in disk form or even be housed in the cars visual display and viewed on the cars huge central display screen. Making a screen print might be problematical. On the other hand, the manufacturer probably has the ability to send updated material and notices directly to your car.

That only addresses the automotive part of our life. I am sure you are aware that reference and owner's manuals flood the rest of our lives as well. Every piece of



languages. The English translation is often the smallest part of the manual. It used to be entertaining to read the fractured grammar of an instruction manual. Perhaps this is still true of some of the more obscure languages, but most often a large effort goes into these manuals to get it right.

In recognition of their effort to communicate some very complex details and concepts, we owe it to the armies of manual writers to respect their efforts. If you are like most consumers, the manual is only referenced in emergencies and stored haphazardly. I have manuals in random drawers and files scattered around my house. Maybe even worse, I retain manuals for things we no longer have. Retaining receipts with the manuals can be useful for warranty and service reference. But, it is all only useful if there is some organization associated with the material. So let's give the owner/assembly/reference manual its due respect. Read your manuals and store them where they can be referenced as an essential part of your life library.


