


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A long-awaited summer is finally here, but first we had to get through an eventful end of spring. June began with our **High Performance Drivers Education DE #2** at Waterford.

This year's SEM PCA High Performance Driver Education (HPDE) season got off to a spectacular start in May.

This year's SEM PCA High Performance Driver Education (HPDE) season got off to a spectacular start in May. Well, to be honest, it all started with planning and getting things in place beginning late last year with the DE Team. A good deal of preparation and thought went into setting up our events well in advance. The season opened with our DE-101 at M1 Concourse followed shortly after by the first day on the track there on the Champion Motor Speedway. Both events were well attended at this great venue and got us going in the right direction. There is quite a bit of excitement for what is still ahead.

Our annual DE-101 event is a non-driving open discussion about what the events are and what they offer to those who attend. The Porsche Club of America's High Performance Drivers Education events (HPDE or DE events) are designed to be a safe, controlled place to learn and practice the proper techniques of car control at higher levels. The DE events are held at race tracks all around the United States by PCA various regions. These venues afford us locations that are both secure and challenging. I'm talking about road racing courses with a variety of challenging curves and elevation changes galore---the roads drivers

dream of and the stuff sports cars were designed for. We in the Southeast Michigan region typically host ours at both M1 Concourse and Waterford Hills Road Racing course. At our DE-101 we talked about how to prepare for the day and what to expect. We covered getting the cars ready, gave an example of a schedule, briefly covered what participants will learn and talked about how much fun they will have! I fielded several questions and left feeling a positive energy for what was ahead for those 'newbies' who attended.

May 21st brought our first on track and classroom sessions for the year. The day began with everyone finding their way to the parking spaces and setting up. From there, registration and a quick drivers meeting followed to get everyone aligned for what was to follow and how we would proceed. With everything covered we were off and running---well almost. Nature has a way of stepping in from time to time. See, these are 'driver education' events and although the focus is primarily on driving our sports cars spiritedly with dry roads and hot tires, we still do run our on-track sessions in the rain. While this may sound a bit intimidating and counter intuitive, it is actually very beneficial. Sure, speeds are reduced and traction levels are lower, but again these events are educational in nature and rain can be a great teaching tool. Well experienced instructors in each car giving excellent guidance in real driving situations keeps all participants safe and having a good time. We do have to pause all the fun though when lightning is present to call the corner workers in from around the track to a safer location. This was the case for a short time during the morning, but the skies soon cleared and we were back underway with instructor sessions to lead off and help dry up the track.

The day continued along with some good classroom instruction and many laps around the track at speed. After a quick stop off for lunch the afternoon the weather continued to be in our favor. Coming to the close of the track, everyone was thankful for a great time and looking forward to our next few events. One individual who had participated in both events this year was a newcomer, Dan Harkcom. He has recapped his experience here:

"I bought my first Porsche in May 2021, a 2000 Boxster, and spent much of that summer going through the car and catching up with maintenance and doing some preventative repairs (i.e. water pump, thermostat, IMS, rear main seal,


clutch, flywheel, etc.). Even though it wouldn't be my daily driver, my goal with any car that I own is that it should be dependable enough to use daily if necessary. I also joined PCA and SEM shortly after purchasing the car. However, between scheduling conflicts and the repair work on the car taking longer than expected I was not able to make it to any club events that year. When 2022 rolled around, I made it a point to make it to some events.

I decided to start with something simple and registered for the HPDE 101 class at M1 Concourse. I figured this would be a good and free way to meet some of the club folks, learn a little bit more about HPDE events and decide if these events were something I'd be interested in trying out. The presentation was helpful and people were very friendly. I left having had my questions answered and with a much better idea of what to expect at a HPDE. I signed up for the M1 Concourse HPDE event the next day, bought a helmet and arranged to have my car inspected. A big thanks to Autocore for taking care of this on short notice and at no charge!

The next two weeks passed quickly and before I knew it the day of the event had arrived. I've competed in and organized SCCA TSD (Time-Speed-Distance) road rallies and run in the occasional RallyCross for the last twenty years, so I'm not a stranger to motorsport. Since this was my first ever track event, I definitely had some opening day jitters. Heavy rain, along with lightning and thunder, started when the first group was scheduled to begin. This necessitated a brief track closure that didn't do much to put me at ease, but the rain passed, the track started to dry out and after a short delay the event began. The track was still wet for my first series of runs, which was a little bit nerve wracking, but after a few laps to get used to conditions along with some great coaching (shout out to Tony Mac), helped me get into the swing of things. A short classroom session and lunch followed and by the time the afternoon rolled around the sun had come out and the track had dried. I got more confident with my car and started to understand optimal lines around corners, where to brake, where to lift and where to keep the pedal to the floor. Each lap

was more rewarding than the last. Great instructors, friendly like-minded people, a fun track and solid event organization made for a day I won't forget anytime soon. This turned out to be one of the most fun automotive events I've been to in a long time. I signed up for the June 10 Waterford Hills event two days after the MI event. My only regret is that, due to travel commitments, it's unlikely I'll be able to attend any of the other HPDEs this summer, but I look forward to going to as many club events this year as I'm able to." - Dan

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Special Editions

I thought I knew all about special edition Porsches. After doing some Internet searching and digging through my library of reference books I found out I knew very little. If anything, the special or limited edition has become more common each year. It seems to be a standard marketing tactic to boost the sales of any model of Porsche that needed it in various numbers from a single car destined only for the Porsche museum to hundreds or even thousands of cars.

In the very early years, a special edition was justified to support the need to homologate a car for competition. It was sort of legalized cheating to convince a racing organization such as the SCCA or the FIA that a vehicle was a standard production model rather than a hand built prototype not for sale to the general public. Perhaps the earliest example of this would have been the 1953 America Roadster. Max Hoffman, the American importer for Porsche, asked for a special model that would be very competitive in the small displacement sports car class. Porsche produced an all aluminum cabriolet with an easily unbolted windshield that could be swapped at the track for a tiny aero screen and bumpers that could be easily removed. With an all aluminum body the car only weighed 1,334 pounds. Naturally, it was far from a production model and only appealed to racers to the extent that only 16 were built. The follow up limited series race car was the 1958 Speedster GS/GT which was an aluminum body version of the steel Speedster, but fitted with a hand build four cam race motor and only 60 were built. Discounting special all out race cars built by Abarth, you have to jump ahead to 1967 and the 911 R. It was a lightened production 911 with a 906 race motor, only 23 were built and none were for sale to the general public.

At this point, there was a shift toward limited production runs which were show cars such as the two 914-8 cars built in 1969 for Ferry and Butzi Porsche. They featured race bodywork with an eight cylinder race motor. Then Porsche offered a series of standard production models with only a decal package to denote them as a special edition, such as the 924 Sebring and the trio of 914 special edition paint jobs such as the black and yellow, orange and beige or white and red. In some cases there really was a limited production run to commemorate a milestone year for a production model, sometimes only distinguished by a dash

plaque serializing the chassis number in the sequence. An example of this would be the 50 930 LE models or the 250 997 Club Sport classics. Others special edition models bowed to customer demand such as the 50th Anniversary Edition, which topped out at 1,963 cars.

Going back to homologation models, in 1981 a series of 17 924 Carrera GTRs were offered all intended for racing. That was followed by the 964 Carrera 4 Lightweight, of which only 22 were built. The more famous race cars created for homologation were the 25 GT1 cars built in 1997 off a mid-engine exaggeration of the 911. The pinnacle of a homologation race car that wasn't, was the 1988 959 Sport of which 25 were built and supposedly only two were street worthy. After that we got a steady diet of production models with the RS moniker. There were two very special limited edition cars, namely the 918 Spyder which had only 981 cars built and the Carrera GT of which only 1,270 were built from 2003 to 2007. This culminated with the 50th edition 911 50Y and its counter point, a hand built replica of a 1973 Targa 911S created by Porsche Design. Both were painted black and destined only for the Porsche Museum.

All of this only proves that Porsche enthusiasts will pay almost anything to get an exclusive edition, even when it is not particularly exclusive or commemorative. How much more this exclusivity is worth or how much value it retains is yet to be determined. ■

Horsepower in Horse Country

The nineteenth annual Keeneland Concours d'Elegance will be held on July 16, 2022 in the heart of horse country, Lexington, Kentucky. The venue is the historic Keeneland Race Track. The Feature Marque will be Porsche. Four of the 20 judged classes will be Porsche. In addition, the PCA Bluegrass Region (BGS) will be holding a Porsche Hospitality Park inside the dedicated Car Club Paddock area. On the day prior to the concours, the BGS will also be hosting PCA Friday at Keeneland. PCA events this day will include a morning Concours Appreciation Training Session and an afternoon drive through horse country. Other activities available for visitors to enjoy include self-guided Walking Tours of the venue, visit to Gift Shop, observing Morning Thoroughbred Workouts, Meals at the Track Kitchen, Back Scenes of Concours site prep and the Keeneland Library. Also, nearby attractions include the KY Horse Park, the KY Aviation Museum, Distilleries, the KY Castle and Horse Farms. You may want to spend the entire weekend!
