

Schweinefiletring (aka Indiana Nürburgring) Tour

Schweinefiletring, also known as the Indiana Nürburgring, is a 180 mile long loop very similar in the shape to the famous public road in Germany called the Nürburgring. The outstanding loop of Indiana roads starts just under an hour south of Indianapolis. The Schweinefiletring gives you a bit of all of the greatest roads east of the Mississippi. If you had the pleasure of going on the SEM/PCA drives, or on your own, to the Triple Nickel or Tail of the Dragon you will quickly be harkened back to the driving pleasure you experienced there. The undulations remind you of the Triple Nickel and the tight and blind corners bring back part of the thrill of the Tail of the Dragon. The Schweinefiletring isn't just the greatest hits of those roads, it has its own thrill and beauty to explore.

The SEM/PCA overnight trip to the Schweinefiletring started on August 6th in Ann Arbor. Half of the group met at Zingerman's to do the caravan down to Columbus IN. The weather started out overcast, but cleared up the farther south we went. We stopped for lunch at a British restaurant called Payne's in Gas City IN. The food was great and the large statue of Garfield was entertaining. We continued

on and arrived at our hotel. In what is now becoming a tradition, we went to Texas Roadhouse for dinner as they seem to always be next to the Holiday Inns that we stay at. An interesting note about the hotel was that they had Porsche themed hounds tooth furniture in the room!

We started the actual drive the next morning at 9:30 AM. The weather called for partly cloudy skies and possible scattered thunderstorms. The first driving segment had us heading southwest on the east side of the ring. After a very short drive through town we were immediately out on the back roads. What's great



about Indiana's back roads is that they are like their British counterparts, paved, no lane markings and with very little traffic. There are so many paved backroads that you would think Indiana doesn't have any dirt roads, but I was recently proved wrong on this. All of these great back roads link

together making it seem like you are running your own rally stage.

The roads here are like the 555. It didn't take long before we found our first closed road. Just like Michigan, Indiana is fixing a lot of bridges. We had to turn back a few miles to get to the main road to continue on. As we tried to turn back on the backroads, again we faced another road closure. This was only for the next 10 miles, then we were able to get back on the planned route. Due to the reroute we were a bit behind on time. We continued on to the bottom of the loop. This part of the drive is a lot like Hocking Hills, sweeping turns with great forest views. At the bottom of the loop we stopped at the Shoals Overlook, it gave a nice view of a river. We headed back northeast towards out lunch stop. After the overlook the road turns into the backroads like around the Tail of the Dragon. As we continued on, the next stop was at the William Covered Bridge. After the bridge it was a short hop to lunch.

Our lunch stop was at Smokin Jim's BBQ. The reason the Schweinefiletring is promoted by the locals is to get you to stop at one of these BBQ joints. We soon ran into rain as we were leaving town and getting to the backroads. The road soon turned tight and twisty with steep inclines and declines. At this point we are driving through Bloomington to go east back to the hotel. The roads continued to curve as we ascended to the next stop. We stopped at the Bean Blossom Overlook, this gave us a view of the area we had been driving all day. We set on and descended down traveling through a tourist trap town called Nashville IN. It was packed with people on the sidewalks and had a bit of traffic. We bee lined back to the hotel as soon as we cleared the traffic.

At the conclusion of the run, every participant had a smile on their face. It was a great day of driving excellent roads with great scenery. Thank you to all who participated and made this a great event!

One of the club's most anticipated events, the club picnic, started out with a whimper. On Sunday, August 21st, at 8 a.m. it was raining and it didn't look like much hope for better weather. A Daily Driver to Show Off

My own personal vehicle, is, in fact, a truck. A big Burgundy Bubba truck that handles like a boat and loses its power steering in parking lots. I got it partially because I knew I needed its 4 wheel drive capabilities in the snow, and partially because it was the only thing I could afford I didn't have to fold myself sideways and hunch my back to drive while my kneecaps sat somewhere inside the dashboard (even with the seat all the way back).

I say this in order to give contrast to the car my grandfather and I took to the August 21st Concours' D Elegance, a Black 1998 Porsche Boxster with a brown leather interior, my grandmother, Freda's "daily driven" Porsche. It has over 170,000 miles on the odometer and the nose of the car wears its rock chips with pride, which is really where every similarity stops. This particular Boxster has 3 piece rims (and about a thousand little places to catch dirt, as I was about to find out with some Windex and a paper towel on the floor of the parking lot) and a sleek low profile evocative of a wave coming to tide. Most importantly of course, the 2.5L Flat-6 engine sits just behind the cabin with its steady, almost feline rumble.

Most of the time this wouldn't be my grandparent's first choice for a Concours' D Elegance but since rain had been forecasted we elected to go with the car that had somewhat modern suspension in order to handle the damp roads on the way to the event and prospective rain later. This car was so unprepared for the Concours we hadn't even washed the wheels since the plan had been to bring my grandpas 1965 356C slate-gray Cabriolet with a tan top.

In any case, we set out into the humid Michigan air, engine growling, as we drove through the tree lined landscape in order to reach the park ahead of time so we could spend as much time as possible in the event period to tidy up the Boxster's appearance. My sister, Reese, and mother, Lolly, followed behind us in a 2016 Volkswagen Golf GTI (along with our French bulldog, Favor, who met a fellow Frenchie and his Porsche-owning parents). When we all arrived in the parking lot, the work began.

I set about wiping away what sap and debris from the bodywork I could with a rag, keeping my work in circles in order to minimize streaking so I wouldn't have to spend as much time on it later with a clean, dry rag. My much shorter sister, Reese wiped away at the wheels with paper towels doing her best to remove the wax and sap that had gotten on the wheels as we drove along, picking away at what was left over from the car's last deep clean. By the time I looked up from the rear quarter panel about ten more cars had arrived, and, as my mother quipped, "clearly they were all the backup Porsches." I looked up and realized that indeed, most of the other participants had expected rain as well, bringing their less fragile vehicles along. The last time I'd been to the Concours there had been a sunny forecast and more 356's and 911's with whale tails and rubber bumpers. This time half the cars seemed younger than I am, meaning they had been built in the 21st century.

I started working my way bottom to top on the Boxster as I moved along the rear quarter panels and doors, always careful to make sure that I changed the folded side of the rag I was using and shaking out the debris in order to decrease the likelihood of adding a new scratch. Breakfast had already started when I finished up my work with the front of the Porsche so I headed that way in order to get a breakfast sandwich, my grandfather's favorite part of the menu.

After we finished eating I did a once over on the entire body with a clean rag and started using my pinkie in an attempt to clean out each lock point of the rims as I dug out the dirty brake dust that had accumulated there and did my best to remove the wax buildup leftover on the bottom of the rims.

By this point I'd taken off my hoodie due to the heat from the sun coming out of clouds briefly, peeking in between breaks in the coverage, illuminating the glittering black paint as she sat there.

The Boxster came in third, of course, despite the elbow grease and half gallon of Windex we used, but in the first place it wasn't supposed to be there. A last-minute pinch-hitter for the gloriously waxed and detailed 356C Cabriolet sitting safely in Grandpa's garage, the Boxster is Freda's much-loved, "daily driver" Porsche.






Saving gas when we drive has become a popular topic in today's world of high gas prices and efficient cars. The ultimate goal is the trend toward electric cars and hybrid cars. Of course, this is nothing new and the practice of achieving high gas mileage started decades ago in competitions known as hypermiling. Hypermiling is the adoption of driving styles or techniques to optimize the miles per gallon of fuel used when driving. Results in the hundred plus miles per gallon could be achieved, but only by professionals using some extreme driving techniques. While I would not advocate for extreme driving techniques just to save a miniscule amount of gas, there are several factors we all could be mindful of when we drive.

Back in 1973 our club combined a driving tour with a gas mileage competition in which I was the proud recipient of a third place trophy, competing in my 1969 911S Targa. The 911 was a particular gas hog of the lineup which made the trophy more significant. The goal was to achieve the most miles per gallon above the factory given average, which I believe was about 18 mpg. I think, with my father along as my coach, I achieved about 27 mpg. I took my father along because he always drove as though he was in a competition in the family station wagon, a 1964 Ford with a Police Interceptor V8 and automatic. This gas hog, especially when loaded with a full family of six kids and a luggage rack on the roof, had terrible gas consumption especially on our long summer trips. My father's self-completion would be to make the fewest gas stops without incurring the ire of our mother. Some trips cut the margins pretty thin, but he never ran to

Thanks to our Department of Transportation (DOT) and their Corporate Average Fuel Economy (CAFÉ) standards we all have become unintentional hyper mileage experts. Today's cars have incorporated many features to maximize fuel mileage including the latest start stop technology which can save between 2 and 10 ounces of gas on every short trip. But, that doesn't mean we can't all improve on these numbers. As the window stickers say your mileage may vary depending on conditions and driving habits.

Some of the things to do include the following: Be mindful of the condition of the vehicle including the state of tune including oil level and cleanliness with fresh oil, clean oil filter, clean air filter and clean gas filter. Maintain optimum tire pressures within 2 psi of the factory recommendation remembering ambient air temperatures will raise or lower tire pressure as much as 2 psi for every ten degrees. Tire age can

also affect pressure as well as rolling resistance. Eliminate useless weight that is carried especially in the trunk. Remove roof racks when not in use as they act as a huge spoiler and for that matter reconsider adding stylish air spoilers.


Driving habits are the biggest contributors to good fuel economy and the easiest ways to mileage improvements. To begin with consider how you start the car and the trip. The engine warm up can use disproportionate amounts of gas. Accelerate and brake gently. Consider the traffic around you as well as patterns of traffic, stop lights and signs. Minimize the amount of idle time and warm up the engine at moderate speeds. Don't use hard acceleration until the temperature gage has begun to move. Plan trips to minimize cold starts and multiple starts. Minimize hard stops and long waits at lights. Look far ahead in traffic to minimize variations in speed and lane changes. Coast whenever possible to avoid excessively using the brake and accelerator. Be aware of elevation changes to avoid having to accelerate to maintain speeds uphill and take advantage of down hills gradients to maintain speeds. Stopping on an uphill gradient is going to waste gas. When stating from a dead stop, use the minimum amount of throttle to achieve traffic flow and speed limits while achieving the quickest possible advancement of gear ratio and best use of engine torque. Be aware of when the transmission reaches high gear and stays in high gear and use the minimum throttle usage to achieve the highest gear per situation. Much has been said about drafting, but it is a dangerous practice and really is not effective enough to warrant the risks. Far more can be gained from maintaining smooth traffic flow. Use cruise control on highways to avoid throttle changes on level roads, but do not use it in traffic or when there are many hilly areas.

These driving habits apply to electric as well as hybrid vehicles. In fact, when it comes to hybrids there is a technique of using the throttle at speeds between 14 and 40 which maximizes battery power use. Using the economy gage can indicate the best range for using light throttle to avoid switching to gas engine use. Instant gas mileage gages can help tune your driving habits, although they are not fitted as much on modern cars. Some people use the miles to empty reading to help keep track of driving habits. Just tracking fuel usage at gas fill ups and the trip odometer is a good method of watching your driving habits. If nothing else, good driving habits saves wear on your cars well as saving fuel. We all can achieve hypermiling with not much more than using common sense as we drive.
