





Emblems

All of our cars are represented by some sort of symbol, always copyrighted, that represents the model of car in a unique way that is meaningful to the buying public. In the case of our Porsches it is the instantly recognizable crest. But, the specific Porsche model does not have a separate symbol such as an animal or geometric design. It is fascinating to look at some of the automobile symbols and trace their heritage. Many of these symbols are unchanged from the creation of the company, such as the prancing horse of Ferrari that shares a similar horse symbol with the Porsche crest. Emblem stories make great trivia questions such as; What single car is named after two animals? That would be the Mustang Cobra. But, the predecessor to the mighty Mustang is the humble Falcon. At the end of this article is an added bonus about the history of the Spirit of Ecstasy that you may not know.

Ford is credited with the oldest car symbol, a stylized scripted Ford dating back to 1903. For animal symbols, nothing beats Ferrari with its prancing horse dating back to the creation of its racing team in 1929. The story is that the black rearing horse was used on the WWI fighter plane of Count Francesco Baracca, who tragically lost his life in battle. The symbol was prominently displayed on his fighter plane. His father and mother approached Enzo Ferrari and suggested he adopt the horse on his cars emblems for good luck. The yellow shield back ground is the official color of the home town of Modena, still headquarters of Ferrari. No Ferrari leaves the factory, race or street car without a prancing horse emblem.

The Lamborghini Bull symbol comes from founder Ferruccio Lamborghini's Zodiac sign of Taurus or Bull. He was a patron of Ferrari and as the story goes that he had the nerve to criticize how his Ferrari was built directly to the face of his friend Enzo. Enzo suggested he stick to building tractors which encouraged Ferruccio in 1963 to try his hand at sports cars. Every Lamborghini since has been named after a fighting bull.

The Porsche prancing horse comes from the crest of the Free Peoples State of Wurttemberg-Baden of which Stuttgart is the capital and the home of Porsche. The black rearing horse represents that Stuttgart was originally a stud farm. Various stories have the actual symbol being drawn on napkins by Ferdinand. It is not the actual crest of the city, but a stylized symbol for the company which has remained unchanged since 1945 and the company founding in 1931.

Jaguar is another car with a famous direct tie to a ferocious animal, the jaguar. In 1922 the company was the Swallow Sidecar Company, still in Whitley, Coventry, England. When Jaguar got into the car business in 1945 a more serious mascot

was needed. Originally used as a radiator ornament, it has lasted through several ownership changes as an iconic symbol and is instantly recognized by any automotive enthusiast.



Many car symbols started their

life as radiator ornaments. Some were animal inspired such as the Studebaker Swan, the Ford and Lincoln Greyhound as well as the Ford Quail. Chevrolet used the Eagle, Cadillac the Heron while Chrysler used a Gazelle. On Listcarbrands.com we find horses as the most prominent car symbol used today, but animals can be found on car crests of some 53 different cars and plus the bulldog on Mack trucks and ram sheep on Dodge Ram trucks.

American car manufacturers used a wide variety of animal and bug mascots ranging from the Hudson Hornet to the Buick Skylark and Wildcat. It is a fun challenge to see how many animals your friends can name. Easy ones are the Ford Mustang and Pinto, Mercury Cougar and Ford Raptor. Chevrolet has the Impala and Stingray while Chrysler has the Eagle, Barracuda and lest we forget the Road Runner and Viper. More obscure is my favorite, the AMC Marlin. Foreign obscure names would be the Fiat Panda, Nissan Bluebird and Leopard as well as the VW Beetle and Fox.

Now I give you as a bonus, the fascinating and enchanting story of the Rolls Royce famous mascot The Spirit of Ecstasy, the most recognized car emblem ever. Wikipedia tells the story of how Rolls Royce commissioned the sculpture. Charles Sykes had sculpted The Whisperer, a similar female figure in flowing gown holding a finger to her lips signifying the silence of the running car. The original sculpture was commissioned by Baron John Montagu for his personal 1909 Silver Ghost and embodied his secret passion for Eleanor Velasco Thornton, who Sykes chose for his model. Eleanor was the secretary to John Walter, editor of The Car Illustrated and involved in a secret love affair with him for over a decade. Rolls was concerned that owners were affixing inappropriate radiator cap ornaments to their cars. Managing Director Claude Johnson commissioned Charles Sykes to propose at more dignified and graceful design. He modeled the Spirit after The Whisperer. On February 6, 1911 Sykes presented the Spirit of Ecstasy to Rolls and it was afterwards listed as an optioned extra, but it has become standard since the 1920's. Eleanor died tragically on December 30, 1915 when the SS Persia was torpedoed by a German U Boat in WWI. Today's Sprit stands three inches tall and hides away in the radiator shell when parked to dissuade theft.



For many years, club members and guests have brought their cars out to local tracks to gain both a better understanding of performance driving and a deeper appreciation for these wonderful cars. It's through dedication and pure enjoyment that these events are organized each year. This year has brought some extra challenges and I'm proud to say that the SEM PCA DE Team has persevered to finally get our season kicked off.

Our season opener was originally planned for May at M1Concourse. Understandable, this was cancelled due to the situation I don't think I need to mention. The planned June event at Waterford Hills still fell within certain state mandates that caused us to reschedule to July. As with most things in our lives this year, we kept our spirits up and waited for the times to improve. For myself, this meant more time on the video game race simulator that I use to scratch the itch over the long winter months. Not the same, but gets my mind off of it.

July was here and the day had finally come. Our day was not off to the start we had hoped for though as the morning began with clouds that brought rain during our typical morning routine of registration, track walk, and drivers meeting. Yet, this did not seem to dampen anyone's mood. We were all happy to be together and socializing (at a distance of course). The Drivers Education on track sessions run even in the rain. These are truly educational and participating in one with rain is something that I bet even the most seasoned casual road driver could learn from. Many are apprehensive at first and may not even want to engage in a rainy day. My years of experience has shown me time and time again that after students do it once, they are much more comfortable and even enjoy the adventure.

Even our sponsors came out in full force and were happy to support us. Autocore Performance Group, Munk's Motors, and our newest sponsor M1 Motorsports Group were all on hand to help out with automotive advice, service questions, and refreshments. Great to have them on board with us and making our events that much better.

First on the track was the instructor group. Many of our instructors have purpose built track cars with slick tires, higher performance brakes, and stiffer suspensions. Understandably, most did not want to go out on track as this combination does work the same as street cars in the rain. I had a little tread on my tires and the suspension was still set to soft so I went out for a few reconnaissance laps. I was joined by our Chief Instructor Marc Molzon. This worked well as Waterford Hills was re-repaved (that is not a typing error. It had to be done twice ... but that's another story) and we wanted to check out the track conditions. We came back in and reported our findings to the other groups prior to them going out. This gave them some insight on how to approach their first sessions.

This year we have had to adjust our program to fit current regulations. We normally put instructors in cars with students to provide immediate feedback and guidance. For this event, we had our coaches observing from corner stations and reporting to the students after each session. While not what I would prefer, this method still provided the students with valuable information on how to improve. Several people told me that they were pleased with the results and appreciated the feedback. We have also added something new, a Touring Session Group. These still offer time on the track, but with more controlled speeds. They also include classroom time and all the activities other groups enjoy. You can read more about these sessions in the article written by Jason Khami. Sounds like he was pretty satisfied with his day.

The rain came to a stop around lunch and the afternoon brought a drying track. These conditions can be deceiving as areas that look dry may not have the traction you'd expect. Again, a learning experience. Our instructors kept the students up to speed about this, so everyone played well together. By the end of the day the sun was shining and smiles were abundant. It was great to get out and enjoy our cars and friends. Our social lives are all struggling this year and it was awesome we could put on an event like this in a way that kept everyone safe and at acceptable distances. I am very excited and looking forward to doing it all again on August 7th. If you have never joined us for one of these experiences, I cannot encourage you enough to come out and try it. The cars, friends, and fun make for a great day.



HPDE-Touring Group Pandemic Edition

Aquestion so often asked of Porsche owners is, "Have you taken it to the track?"

A great way to ease drivers into track days is the High Performance Drivers Education (HPDE) Touring Group. This group provides an option to take your car to the track with minimal risk of damage. The Touring Group offers guidance on braking, turn-in, turn-out, along with gentle reminders to look ahead and breathe.

We walked the 1.5 miles of the Waterford Hills Racetrack and attended the mandatory drivers meeting on Thursday, July 16. We learned the meanings of the different flags, what hand signals would be used to communicate passing intent with the other drivers and the proper procedure to enter the paddock area.

Parts of HPDE have changed due to the ongoing pandemic including social distancing and face masks. With the new Touring Group, you drive by yourself, an instructor or helmet are not required. The instructor instead is in a pace car limiting the speed on the track to 60 MPH.

After 20 minutes of track time on the hills, straights, and curves of Waterford Hills, the Touring Group was flagged back into the Paddock. The pace car instructor paired with our group asked each of us how we felt about our time on the track and offered some pointers based on our responses. We watched the other groups take to the track with many purpose-built race cars and daily drivers.

After lunch, we used the advice from the instructor for our second outing of 20 minutes. After our run was completed we returned again to the Paddock and asked if there were other HPDE track days scheduled and if we were ready to move up to the next skill group.

This was the first 2020 HPDE session for the Southeast Michigan Porsche Club. It's great to get out with the people and cars for a much-needed release from the pandemic. The Touring Group requires participants to have a good working car of their choice. Speeds are limited so the normal wear and tear on brakes and tires that cars experience during a regular track day is minimal.

HPDE and track days in general are a great way to escape the restrictions of the pandemic, learn about your Porsche or other car and have fun at the track through this new Touring Group experience.

Come out to the track for our next SEM HPDE event on August 7.


