Drive With Spirit!

want to start by thanking Greg Gallagher and all who came out to attend the Spring Tour event. If you joined us, you know we had a little issue with the weather and it felt more like a fall tour. Lucky, I had my winter gloves in my Boxster, which made a few people wish they had theirs. Fortunately, most had dressed for the weather. Greg did another great job with the driving tour. Dinner at Bravo was fantastic and gave new and longtime members ample opportunities to get acquainted.

Once again, this year's Detroit Grand Prix was another superb performance by the Alex Job Racing Team. Last year they came to our shop to prep their Porsche 991 GT America's before the Indianapolis race. That allowed us to see firsthand all the behind the scenes efforts involved in the preparation, setup and running of these amazing factory built race cars.

This year's GT race was just as exciting as last year's, but this year the #23 Team Seattle/Alex Job Racing car came first in class and the #22 WeatherTech Porsche came in fourth. With the addition of rain, there was plenty of action on the track. Most of the Porsche club members who came out to enjoy the race were seated in grandstand 2, located at turn one, just past the start finish line.

With about three laps to the finish, the rain started again, which was a problem because all of the cars where on slick tires. The #58 Brumo's Porsche hit the wall at turn one hard enough that he wasn't going anywhere. At this point a safety truck pulled out to block the #58 from being hit by another race car. The problem was that the safety truck was not in a safe place either. As race cars passed the safety truck, you could feel the tension of everyone in the grandstand because race cars where coming close to it.

At the checkered flag, a member of the safety crew got out of the truck to help the stranded driver in #58. This is when the Aston Martin—on slicks—locked up in the rainwater on the track and hit the wall, sending it hurtling towards the rear of the safety truck. The safety truck went three feet in the air as the corner worker tried to jump out of the way. Everyone in the grandstand got up and that's when two more cars hit the wall and piled up behind the safety truck. It was very sad to see that the Alex Job Racing #22 WeatherTech 911 was the second car to hit the wall and end up behind the Aston Martin.

One of the corner workers was seriously injured. We wish them a fast and complete recovery.

Alex Job Racing also announced at the Detroit Grand Prix that they have ordered two new 911 GT cars for 2016.

According to Porsche: Based on the Porsche 911 GT3 RS production sports car, the purpose-built 911 GT3 R develops more than 500 horsepower. Special attention has been paid to lightweight design, better aerodynamic efficiency, reducing consumption, improving handling and further optimizing safety as well as lowering service and spare parts costs with the car.

Adopted from its production sibling, the 911 GT3 R features the distinctive double-bubble roof and the lengthened wheelbase, when compared to the previous generation 911 road-going car. This helps balancing weight distribution and helps create predictable handling particularly in fast corners in comparison to the preceding GT3 R. By applying systematic lightweight solutions for the body, add-on parts, and suspension, the engineers significantly optimized the center of gravity position of the GT3 R compared to the earlier model. The lightweight body design of the 911 GT3 RS production sports car featuring intelligent aluminum-steel composite construction has proven to be the ideal basis for the race car. The roof, front cover and fairing, wheel arches, doors, side and tail sections as well as the rear cover are made of particularly light carbon-fiber composite material (CFRP). All windows—and for the first time even the windshield—consist of polycarbonate.

Powering the new 911 GT3 R is a cutting-edge four-liter flat-six unit which is mainly identical to the high-performance production engine of the road-legal 911 GT3 RS. Direct Fuel Injection as well as variable valve timing technology ensure the optimized use of fuel. Moreover, the normally aspirated engine offers significantly better drivability and a broader usable rev range. Power from the rear engine is transferred to the 12.2-inch rear wheels via a Porsche sequential six-speed constantmesh gearbox. As in the GT road-going models of the 911, the driver changes gears via shift paddles conveniently positioned on the steering wheel. (Information provided & sourced by motorsport.com)

I wasn't able to attend the Waterford Hills Family day at the races, but I was told it was well attended and everyone had a great time. Club members gave rides to our friends from Jo Brighten Special Olympics during parade laps. I heard they were talking about it the next day.

If you missed this event, join us at the club driver's education sessions or another social driving event. In July, we have the always-popular Progressive Dinner on the 11th and Autobahn Night on the 24th, which is the Friday before the Concours of the Americas at St. John. Our next DE is August 7 and 8, in conjunction with the Club Race weekend at GingerMan. Be sure to register early; these events have limited capacity and tend to sell out.

You probably know that the Porsche 919 hybrids captured first and second overall at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, run on June 13 and 14th. In only their second year of competition, the Porsche prototypes managed to snap Audi's five year winning streak in what is arguably the world's premiere sports car race.

By the time you read this I will have attended the 60th Anniversary Porsche Parade. I am eager to return to French Lick, IN. I went there with the 356 club during one of the East Coast Holidays. I will have a write up on Parade next month. Until then, Drive With Spirit!

IN THE SHARK TANK

The Wheels on the Porsche Go Round and Round

ne of the challenges of having an older car is to keep it looking relevant. Another challenge is finding tires that can cope with the speeds capable of a bygone supercar. Which brings us to the topic of wheels or rims.

There are a number of general things to consider when looking at wheels beyond just the looks. Obviously they need to fit. But what does that mean? Most modern Porches use the same bolt pattern (5 x 130mm), so even though you can usually bolt on a set from one car to the other, there are differences that you need to be aware of that can really change the driving experience if you're not careful.

Offset. Offset or sometimes called backspacing is the distance from the centerline of the wheel to the mounting surface on the wheel. Porsche wheels generally say ET, which stands for *Einpresstiefe* which translates as "insertion depth." What this means

is how far in or out the wheel is protruding. But it's backwards in the sense that a high ET means there is a greater distance from the centerline to the mounting surface. In other words, the bigger the ET, the further in the wheel will sit—the smaller the ET, the further out it will sit.

Why is offset such a big deal? If the offset is wrong, your tires and wheels may rub on the fenders or suspension parts. So it's important to do you research to find out what the proper offset is for you car.

Wheel width. Wheel width is also inter-related with off-

set, because offset is determined from the centerline of the wheel and does not take wheel width into consideration. For example, if you have an 8" wide wheel and a 10" wheel and they both have an offset of 25mm (1 inch), the 8" wheel's face will be roughly 3 inches from the mounting surface of the hub (8"/2 – 1" = 3"). However, the 10" wheel's face will sit 4 inches from the hub (10"/2 – 1" = 4"). So you can see how offset and rim width can dramatically affect how a wheel will fit on a car.

Wheel diameter. Wheel diameter generally does not affect the wheel's position in the wheel well. Except that you need to ensure that the wheel will have sufficient clearance for the caliper and pos-

sibly suspension components. The other major concern with wheel diameter is tire availability. The available selection for tires that will fit 16" and 17" diameter wheels has steadily dwindled as the industry has moved to 18", 19", 20" and larger diameter wheels.

So let's take all this information and consider the optimal wheel size for a 928. Early 928's came from the factory with a 15" "phone dial" wheel, and had an option for a 16" version as well. All 4 wheels were the same size and generally had ET67 – and were generally 7" wide wheel. Factory tires were generally a 205/50 15 or 16, but you could run up to a 225.

Later cars went to a staggered stance with an 8"x16" wheel in the front and 9"x16" in the rear. The GTS saw the same staggered setup, but wheel diameters increased to 17".

The key to selecting a wheel that will fit the 928 is getting the correct offset. Assuming an 8" wheel in the front, it is generally

recommend having an offset of at least 55mm. This is for 2 reasons: 1) it maintains the handling characteristics of the 928, 2) it keeps the wheel/tire from rubbing on the fender. I have seen people run as low as an ET50 on the front, but the handling does suffer. For rear wheels, there are many more options and offset does not seem to be as much of a constraint.

Today, there are a number of modern wheels that fit the 928 that can also update its looks. One of the more popular wheels is the Carrera III. These are 18" wheels that came in two flavors. All




Here's a good view of why offsets are so important. You can see on my GT how the wheels just tuck in

had 8" front wheels with ET57 (Perfect for a 928) but the rears came in "Narrow body" which meant a 10" wheel with a 58ET; and the "Wide body" which meant an 11" wheel with a 51ET.

The narrow body fits perfectly on the 928 and you can run a 275 tire without issue. Some have even run a 295, but depending on the year of your 928, it could cause some rubbing. The wide body wheel is what I personally run and it it's very tight. Despite having to roll the rear fenders to get the wheels to tuck in, they do look spectacular.

There are other Porsche wheels that will fit the 928, just be



i. My name is Isaac Cohen and I am nine years old. On Sunday, June 7, my grandfather, Michael Cohen, took me and my dad, Josh Cohen, to Family Day at Waterford Hills. We drove to the race track in Grandpa Michael's silver Porsche 996 cabriolet. I asked him if I could shift the gears, but he said I had to sit in the back seat.

After my grandpa paid at the entrance, we drove in and then took a left and parked on a hill between turns two and four with lots of other Porsches. Fred Young directed us to our parking space. Then we walked to the fence and watched a race that was in progress. Grandpa Michael saw a lot of SEM/PCA members and introduced them to me and Dad. They included Gretus Hoogestraat, Greg Gallagher and his daughter Meg, Tom Fielitz, Lisa Molson, Miranda Christen and some guy named Chipmunk (Chris Braden).

Then the fun began. Tony Mac drove his BMW M3 race car up to the hill so people could see his car and he let me sit in the driver's seat. That was cool! Later, Merritt Scott Collins brought

her Porsche 924 race car to the hill, and she let me sit in it too! And guess what—both of them won their races! In fact, Tony set a track record for class T1, turning a 1:11 lap time.

At lunch time, we drove parade laps around the track. That was fun! Grandpa Michael put the top down and sitting in the back seat, I would throw my arms in the air and feel the air rush by. Those Wheels

ou really can't talk about the visual and performance features of a car without recognizing the wheels. A set of wheels can make or break the marketability of a car. The wrong set of wheels can overshadow other positive aspects of a car.

The first set of car wheels were wooden spokes with iron tires, the design an exact copy of what was used on horse-drawn wagons. Even after rubber tires were invented, they were still mounted on wooden spoke wheels. Some exotic cars were said to have artillery carriage spoke wheels. Perhaps those were the first premium or aftermarket car wheels. And if you thought your multi piece wheels are high tech, consider that all wheels originally had a detachable rim to facilitate tire changes. Tire changes would occur often with primitive rubber tires and roads far more rotten than even our current roads. Perhaps we have not progressed as far as we thought.

Wood spoke wheels ultimately gave way to steel because of their cheaper manufacture and longevity, only partly for style. The more expensive the car, the fancier the wheel and so it still goes to-day. Porsches were no exceptions to that trend. The very first cars designed by Ferdinand Porsche had wooden spoke wheels. But by the time of the 356, steel was in. The original 356 did not have the wheels you might expect. The original wheels were 16-inch diameter but only 3½ inch wide. That matched the dimensions of the available tires of that time. As tire technology changed, the wheels changed to meet the specifications of the engineers.

Wheel styles changed from a very wide bolt circles to smaller circles to today's center lock single wheel fasteners. Again, if you think that technology is exotic, just look back at how the original wood spoke wheels were fastened. The wheels used to have cooling slots in the lug nut covers or hub caps. The trend for exotic cars was bright chrome wheels to accent the bright chrome accents of the rest of the car. Chrome steel wheels were a popular Porsche option for decades. Car racing evolved to promote the marketing of cars which carried some aspects of the race car over to the street models. The most visual racing carry over was the wheel, but the exotic metals of race wheels were not always practical for street applications. Tire manufacturers also started to adapt their race tire designs for street use. Soon, the wheel dimensions were changed radically, starting with the wide rim with small diameter and then to increasing larger diameters and narrower rims. The large diameter tire put down a bigger contact footprint while the narrow rim limited the aero drag of the tire and didn't require the large, air-obstructing fenders.

Perhaps the biggest shift in wheel design was the introduction of cast alloy wheels. Of course, this had a profound impact on the

steel wheel manufacturing industry. At first, the styled stamped steel wheel was a performance statement at a reasonable cost. As the cost of materials and manufacture of cast alloy came down, the styled steel wheel became less desirable. But steel wheels, often with a plastic wheel cover that mimicked an alloy wheel, still appear on more economical cars. With cast alloy wheels, wheel surface treatments became a fashion statement. The alloy surface



often had to have corrosion protection which was usually paint or anodizing. When Porsche released the earliest 911 with the now-ubiquitous five spoke wheels, the surfaces looked polished but were in fact an anodized coating that could be damaged by harsh cleaning solutions. Another popular option was to chrome plate the alloy wheel which would seem to defeat the objectives of a light wheel for the sake of high style. Painted alloy wheels offered a style compromise and opened up a wide palette of matching and contrasting wheel colors, especially by the German manufacturers. The current trend of black painted wheels would seem to mask wheel design but is in fact a style statement. I am still waiting for the flat-finished painted wheel to match flat car finishes. Wheel spoke design has shifted from the impossible to keep clean wire wheel effect to wide open four or five spoke models.

The biggest impact of high styled wheels is in aftermarket wheel replacement. For decades, the manufacturer dictated the sizes and styles of wheels. Wheel designs were most often styled by the manufacturer to define a segment of the car market. Luxury cars had highly-styled wheels. Performance cars had light weight wheels of larger than standard dimension both in width and diameter. To meet customer needs for unique styled wheels, the aftermarket wheel makers started to offer a wide array of styles and sizes. Digital machine tools made it possible to create one-off custom made wheels. Tire manufacturers were matching wheel demands with limited production tires of previously unheard-of dimensions. A 24-inch diameter wheel with a very low aspect ratio tire presents a funhouse mirror image of a car wheel that once again resembles the original wagon wheel with steel tire.


There is no doubt that car owners have an unprecedented opportunity to make personalized statements through a wheel choice. With aftermarket competition, the car manufacturer has been forced to offer more wheel choices and to look at market demand in their wheel designs.

When we left the track after seeing all of the races, I really







Goodie Store: No report


Event reports: Needed for Spring Tour and Street Survival.

O: I own a 2002 Carrera. I was shocked to see the cords of tire carcass showing on the inside of my rear tires. The fronts were fine but the rears were past bald and on their way to blowout. I only drove about 5,000 miles on those tires. The car drove fine, so why was the tire wear so lousy? My technician suggested an alignment adjustment to more "neutral settings" during an alignment. I drive the car on the street, not the track, so better tire wear appeals to me. Can the alignment be done at one of the major tires retailers at a lower price? What do you suggest? —Mark

A: In all of these cars I have inspected over the years, not one of them was aligned for the best tire wear. Virtually all of them had camber angles in the rear that were close to the maximum. For handling this is great and in a race car you want more negative camber, but you will burn up tires, especially those 11" wide Pirellis.

Negative camber is the inward tilt of the rear wheels. A Porsche corners like it is on rails due to the design of its suspension and negative camber. To an alignment technician, resetting the camber is a normal part of a quality alignment. That is not the only thing measured and adjusted, however. The beauty of the Porsche design is that almost all adjustments are available to make the car do what ever you need, alignment wise. Optimal street settings do not work as well on the track. To some Porsche drivers, two alignment settings are preferable with one setting for the street and one for the track, although that can get expensive if you are paying for it every time. There are ways to index both settings so you can adjust the car back where you want it yourself. Setting the rear camber more neutral with the wheel more upright, will improve your tire wear and if you do not plan to take it to the track, it will drive fine.

To answer your question about a tire store alignment, most tire retailers have excellent equipment and a dedicated staff. The first challenge is to know how you want your car aligned and, secondly, finding a technician who can do it and will put in the effort to make it so. Alignments that are done to a price point, rather than to a quality standard, force a technician to make choices. How much time will he spend on your car knowing that, if the job is rated one hour, that's all he will be paid? That depends on the individual tech. Standard alignments are expected to be within a "specified range" not to the manufacturers' specifications. You will sometimes receive a printed form that is color coded so that you know the alignment which was done is "in the green." That should be fine for most cars and drivers. To get a Porsche aligned perfectly requires a technician to get the settings to the exact specifications, not just in the green. Do you want it to be close or do you want it to spec? –MC

O: My 1986 Carrera Turbo is really getting hard to shift both in effort and in accuracy. What do you recommend? -Ron

A: Proper shift function involves three separate systems working well together; the transmission, the clutch, and the shift mechanism. So start at the beginning: Has the transmission oil been checked? If it is over five years old, I suggest that it be changed. Please also note that it's critical your car has the correct type of gear lube. If you want it work right, you have to use the right spec oil. Additives can sometimes improve function of old loose gearboxes as well.

The clutch must disengage properly. The pedal should have a certain amount of free play and it should be relatively easy to push down with three distinct phases of pedal operation. As you begin to push the pedal down it will be initially a bit loose and sloppy, it will tighten up as you reach the "friction point" and then as you get past the mid range operation, is should become a bit easier moving toward the bottom of the pedal's travel. This sensation may be difficult to describe so I suggest that you ask to compare pedal feel with other Porsche owners at a social event to notice the difference. If your intuition tells you that the clutch is not working right, have it checked. You may be right. The earlier cars have a number of clutch adjustment factors that play an important role in both basic clutch function and also in pedal feel. There are also bushings, levers, and a couple springs involved in pedal feel and effort. They wear, break, bind, and are often found out of adjustment. When the clutch fully disengages and when the pedal is comfortable to operate, shifting will be easier. If the car will not shift into reverse when the clutch is fully depressed, you have a real problem and you should not drive the car. This indicates a clutch problem and ignoring it will damage the transmission.

Finally the shifter itself on the 1986 is not well suited for the car and much better products are available. The most common, short shift kits change the location of the fulcrum point of the shift lever and reduce the shift travel while increasing the strength needed to push the shift lever. I have never found a short shift kit that improves shift feel. In most cases, if the shifted poorly before, it will shift worse afterwards. My favorite solution is the WEVO shifter. I have one in my car and I dig it.

As soon as you unwrap the shifter you can tell that it was well engineered and beautifully executed using CNC machining technology. It's made of billet aluminum with bronze bushings and strong socket head cap screws to hold it all together. Another nice feature of the unit is availability of either a traditional lever or a billet machined lever. The stock shifter feels like you are stirring a large pot of porridge with a big wooden spoon. The WEVO cuts through the porridge like


