

In National news, congratulations to the Porsche Racing Team at Le Mans! Porsche had his to say about the race," This year's 24 Hours of Le Mans was a nail-biting race in which all three of the top-finishing LMP1 teams—Porsche, Toyota, and Audi—experienced issues with their race cars that effectively determined their order on the podium. In a stunning breakdown just before the last lap, Toyota's #5 car was passed by the #2 Porsche 919 Hybrid,

> driven by Neel Jani at the time, allowing the German automaker to take the win.

> The #5 Toyota was then excluded from second place because its last lap was too slow, leaving the #6 Toyota as the second finisher and the #8 Audi third. It was not the way Porsche wanted to win, and even Audi expressed disappointment with the result despite making it onto the podium due to Toyota's last-minute folly.

> The #2 Porsche's other drivers were Ro-

main Dumas and Marc Lieb. The driver lineup was the same as the one that scored Porsche its first overall victory with the 919 Hybrid, in a 2014 race in Brazil.

Former Formula 1 driver Mark Webber, Brendon Hartley, and Timo Bernhard piloted the #1 919, which suffered damage from a water-pump failure and relegated it to 13th place. Had Toyota won Le Mans, it would have been the first Le Mans victory for the Japanese automaker, and the second win for a Japanese manufacturer since Mazda won overall in 1991."

Thank you to all our members who have shown their support for the club this year and I look forward to seeing you all soon!





Porsche Driving Experience

ello fellow Porsche enthusiasts I am writing to report back about my experience at the Porsche Sport Driving School Masters Plus course. The euphoria has only now begun to wear off after about month since my return home and 2 HPDE events that I participated in during May.

When you arrive at the track you notice that the Barber Motorsports facility is beautifully landscaped and has several unusual sculptures around the track. By god, they make sure it looks good; they were actually painting the grass when we arrived. There is a giant spider sculpture that was a memorial to the protected spiders who were displaced when the track was constructed. I guess at least one spider still is there! There is also a museum that has a vast collection of Mr. Barber's motorcycles and race cars including several rare Lotus racers.

We began with a drivers meeting where we introduced ourselves and were provided information about what we could expect for the next 3 days. I was confident but still anxious because I skipped the first two courses offered by them. In my group there were folks from Europe and a few from California that participate in racing events and they all own cars like the GT3 RS, Turbo S, GT2RS and Carrera GT. They all had run tracks such as the "the ring" and they were fast drivers. They too skipped the first two classes and this was their first time to run the course at Barber Motorsports. I also drive many high horsepower cars, but the Barber track is new to me, so I helped ease my apprehension by driving the track on simulators and watching YouTube videos. There are plenty of PSDS videos on YouTube. My prep included reviewing a map of the track (internet download), watching the instructor YouTube videos, noting speeds at entrances of turns. The driving video games with 911's at Barber were also helpful.

Barber is the perfect place for a driving school. The track was originally designed as a private track for George Barber to play with his 1700 vintage motorcycles. So, it is about turns and hills more so than high-speed straights. The track is very technical 2.38-mile track with steep elevation changes, 16 corners, two blind crests that makes everyone wish they were tall-

er, a corkscrew, and a couple of hairpin turns; it is riotous fun. I hit 140 MPH in a GT3 in the open track sessions, which had me thinking "I'll brake a little sooner here next lap."

My first session was in the 991 GT3 and we did a lead follow with Hurley Haywood himself. When I was behind Hurley, who was in the Turbo, I hung with him fairly well and was taking the track in. Before the first rotation where I was right behind Hurley we pulled away from the other cars in line by up to 10 car lengths. I felt pretty good when towards the end of the session I hear Hurley say, over the loud speaker in all the cars, "ok guys, let's let everyone catch up".

In between two great sessions with other "top notch instructors", I drove the 991 Turbo S on a wet skid pad that was like being on ICE, making it push and oversteer in a figure 8. I also drove the Cayman GT4 with an instructor and wouldn't you know who I get? Mr. Haywood in the passenger seat. I was humbled when I did a less than smooth heal and toe, but after a few laps later I got it right more often than wrong. At the end of the session he said "Good driving, nice job".

The 2nd day included a ton of track time with open passing and each track session was followed by an instructor debrief with the instructor assigned to watch each driver's progress. In between open track sessions we worked on threshold braking, trail braking on corner entry and car control techniques used to manage oversteer and understeer. We also practiced different lines through the esses where we used the car control techniques (big steering inputs to induce rotation and throttle inputs to control the rotation). We also worked on using throttle-lift techniques to cause the car to rotate more on corner entry. The later throttle lift technique was particularly effective when driving the Cayman GT4, which tends to understeer. When driving the GT4 we were only allowed to shift 2-4th gear, which on this technical track was more than enough. I also was driving with an instructor for one session in the GT3 RS and as he reached over and turned-off the traction control. He said to me he doesn't do this often with any student, but he saw enough

of my driving that he was comfortable with me experiencing the car in its most raw state. He admonished me to make sure I didn't over-drive the car and damage it and least of all, kill the both of us! He also then double checked to make sure I signed for the damage insurance!

The last day we were instructed on technical aspects of defending the racing line, the psychology of passing, and race grid starts. We actually ran 10 lap races where I didn't win, but finished respectably very near the front.

A few things I noted, which surprised me was that tire pressures were not maintained and at times they became greasy in the Alabama spring heat. We were told to monitor the pressure on the instrument cluster and do periodic cool down laps. I also spoke with a guy who heads up the maintenance for the school. I asked him what happens to all the cars when they are rotated out of the PSDS? He told me they are sold with a disclaimer saying that they were PSDS cars and at a substantial discount from MSRP. Surprisingly, he said, they don't perform any accelerated maintenance on these cars. He said they only get fresh Mobil 1 at either every 12 months, or a certain mileage for the car, which I think was 15k miles whichever comes first. Wow! I was in shock about that, but he assured me that Mobil 1 does the job.

I then asked him about the brake fluids; are you using a high temperature fluid or changing the fluid after each 2-3 day event? Keep in mind, I think there were 25 drivers in my 3 day course and we did something like 2-3 sessions per day in groups of 10-12 drivers that revolved while other drivers were doing other activities so the cars were being driven pretty much nonstop each day. He said they flush the OEM fluid one time per year and don't need to bleed the calipers unless we know for a fact that a driver cooked the fluid. Ok, well how about race pads, do you use them, I asked? No OEM pads he said. The maintenance schedule is a testament to the robust cars that Porsche designs for us to drive on the street. All of the cars we were driving over these 3 days are street cars. So don't hesitate to drive your car at HPDE as they are designed to take all that you can give it and then some!

I have to say that ALL the instructors were FIRST CLASS professional race car drivers and all were extremely friendly and helpful. Would I go again? Yes! Next time it will be the Masters GT3 cup car class! I would recommend it to anyone, plus the food was great and I met a ton of very nice folks that share a love for driving and Porsches. Many of them have taken the masters plus class several times. I know I will be joining them!

Thank you to all the participants that came out to enjoy a beautiful day of driving and camaraderie!





IN THE SHARK TANK

Meet "Turq" - a Unique 928

here are a number of very nice 928's rolling around. One of the cleanest, most unique, and most powerful 928's resides right here in southeast Michigan. Eric Manting is the proud owner of a 1991 928 S4 that is unlike any other 928 around. The list of modifications are numerous and extensive, but done so well and so tastefully that most people would never notice.

The name "Turg" comes from its very unusual and somewhat polarizing color. Turquoise metallic is an official factory color and is one of those colors you either love or not. I personally think it is an amazing color.

When the previous owner acquired the car, it was in need of some updating and refreshing, but that's where things went a bit overboard and the list of modifications started.

Exterior modifications:

Most people would mistake this car for a GTS because the rear fenders were replaced with GTS flared fenders, a GTS painted wing, and updated GTS aero mirrors. During the fitment of these accessories, the car had an entire repaint that was done to such high standards, that it looks better than the original factory paint.

In addition to those "standard" GTS modifications, an extensive sunroof delete was performed by replacing the entire roof panel with a factory replacement roof panel. This required cutting out the old roof panel with the sunroof and re-grafting the new factory panel without the cutout and track for the sunroof. I don't want to even think about how expensive this panel was not to mention the labor to install it.

Engine modifications:

The engine was pulled and worked over by Greg Brown of Precision Motorwerks, a well-known 928 engine builder in the Los Angeles area. The engine was bored and stroked to increase capacity from 5.01 to 6.21. The increase in displacement brought horsepower from the stock 320 horsepower to an estimated 450 horsepower. The torque on this car is so great that its name could just as well have been "Torque" instead of "Turq." Every system was gone through including the heads, timing belt, and anything else that needed attention.

While the engine was out and the bodywork was in process all suspension pieces were renewed including control arms, bushings, steering and more.

Interior modifications:

The entire interior was stripped and reworked by Paul Champagne, an exceptional craftsman in southern Texas. The customizations included converting the standard seats to sports seats with a retro psychedelic pattern called "Pascha" engraved into the inserts, gear selector, door panels, and other bits and pieces. All seats were done in black with matching turquoise piping. The attention to detail surpasses even the high standards of the original Porsche factory leather.

The whole package:

Each part of the car is exceptional, but it's the entire package that really makes this 928 stand out. No expense was spared to complete this build. In the world of "over-restored" cars, this is one of the most over-restored cars I've ever seen. The modifications are done so cleanly that you really would never know without seeing the pictures – which you can see and appreciate.

Not only does this car have the looks, but it also has the perfor-

from the host hotel in Dearborn to the Belle Isle Corral.


PCA members came from all over to enjoy the Grand Prix. From the registrations, Florida and Texas were the most distant attendees

Looking up at the World

Around The Zone

f you have driven your Porsche lately you probably noticed that you are looking up at the rest of the cars on the road. The exception being the Cayenne, Macan and Panamera whose height just may be the aspect that makes those Porsches more popular than the Porsche sports car line up. I got my start in a 914-6 which may possibly be the lowest Porsche ever made, low even compared to my 356C. The 914-6 was pretty much eye level with most hub caps, and truck wheels seemed to be as tall as the top. While it did give a feeling of skimming the ground, the sight lines from such a low angle posed lots of issues especially in traffic. There was no possibility of seeing a pattern of traffic when your view of the car ahead was their bumper. Traffic signals and signs were mostly visible from a distance, but the worst part was that other drivers were not in direct eyesight so you could never be sure the other driver saw you. My 1972 911E was a huge improvement, but over the years the rest of the cars on the road seemed to just grow taller and wider so now the 911 feels even smaller. Defensive driving takes on a whole new meaning.

That brings us to the worst feature of small performance cars, the lack of crash protection. By far the new breed of sports car far exceeds the level of crash protection afforded by earlier versions, but the laws of physics will dictate that a large car will always be safer in a crash than a small car. Regardless of safety features, being in a small car means there is less deformable structure surrounding the passengers. There may be ten air bags surrounding the passengers but mass will win out and the larger car or truck will crush the smaller vehicle. That being said I have seen many serious wrecks involving variants of the 911, and in every case the driver walked away. The beetle based shape of the car and the rigid design of the chassis will absorb tremendous impacts with little or no deformation. If you are involved in a crash in a Porsche, I recommend one of the Porsche SUVs as they crash tested well by the NHTSB.

There are also many compelling positives to driving a small Porsche sports car. Most of it is centered on the feel and thrill of driving an efficient and responsive car. Large cars and trucks isolate the occupant from their surroundings. Roads built for larger vehicles create very little stress for the smaller sized vehicles. The width of a normal traffic lane not only offers some sporting opportunities it also provides a buffer zone against the

road behemoths that struggle to stay within their lane. The margins for error are greater and this gives the sports car driver options to avoid collision threats. If you have sufficient awareness of your traffic surroundings you have a greater margin for avoidance given the higher performance margins for braking, swerving and accelerating out of a situation. If you have learned the performance capability of your sports car in driver's schools your instincts will most likely save you



from many situations. The biggest worry you should have is that the inattentive driver will not see you or the behemoth driver will not have the built in performance features to avoid you. It is not much protection to be able to stop from 60 mph in less than 100 feet if the guy behind you needs 125 feet to stop.

The other advantage of the small sports car is on the race track. Most race tracks are at least as wide as a two lane road and often closer to three lanes wide. I know firsthand how challenging it is to drive a racetrack like Waterford in a wide and powerful car like my Corvette Z06 as opposed to my 1972 911. Driving the Z06 is like threading a needle with very little margin for error and the 911 is like having several cornering options and not needing to explore the whole width of the track surface. The only difficulty comes from the fact that big cars and small cars perform differently on the same piece of race track and thus are a challenge to drivers to coexist as they negotiate corners at different rates of speed and possibly different corner approaches and apexes.

The future may never totally resolve the safety problems of widely divergent sizes of vehicles on the road, there will always be huge transport trucks and miniscule performance cars and economy cars. In the age of autonomous driven vehicles both the transport truck and the very small economy sized car may coexist on the road without driver input. You may be relatively safer in a large car but for hard core driving enthusiasts the risks of driving a small performance car are sufficient to guarantee their existence on our crowded roads.

In mid-May, MORPCA held their Club Race and fully instructed HPDE at the Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course. During the 3 days, they ran 4 Sprint races and 2 Enduros as well as practice runs and a fun race on the first day. The HPDE included a lapping day and 2 days of instruction. With 80 racers and 200 DE participants, it made for a very full weekend. MORPCA held a reception on Friday night and an awards banquet was held after Saturday's exciting races due to Mid-Ohio's notoriously unpredictable weather. Sunday morning were the two 70 minute Enduro races, and as the first Enduro started, the snowflakes began to fall. As is customary, I presented awards to winners in the GTC3, GTC4, and GTC5 classes.

During the first weekend in June, PCNA sponsored the Porscheplatz at the Detroit Belle Isle Grand Prix. As I began lobbying for the Porscheplatz in the middle of last year, I was enthused to receive confirmation in February that we would host a Porscheplatz at Belle Isle. I immediately began working with the race organizers to create incentives to help promote the event and encourage participation. One of the incentives was a Free Friday corral pass for the first 30 people to purchase Saturday Porscheplatz Tickets. The second incentive was a Michigan State Police led Caravan on to Belle Isle. Both were extremely successful. Since rooms quickly become scarce and rates skyrocket for this event, I set up a room block at The Henry Autograph Hotel to accommodate anyone travelling from out of town. The room block sold out, and fortunately I was able to increase the number of rooms in the block to provide more members the opportunity to attend, and that sold out as well.

PCA members and Porsche owners from throughout Zone 4 and the surrounding area visited the hospitality tent Friday, and watched the qualifying sessions on the 2 large TV monitors with live feed from the track, while enjoying the beverages provided. Porsche sent posters for those in attendance as well. Porsche of the Motor City brought several cars to display including their 918. Friday night, several of the guests staying in the room block, joined us and National Vice President Tom Gorsuch for dinner.

On Saturday morning, 2 Michigan State Police Cars arrived at The Henry to provide us with an escort to the Porscheplatz. Drivers and passengers in 31 cars met in the lobby to sign waivers and receive some instructions before staging. 
