Our involvement would help draw a larger crowd for this charitable benefit. There is a free beer for people showing their cars.

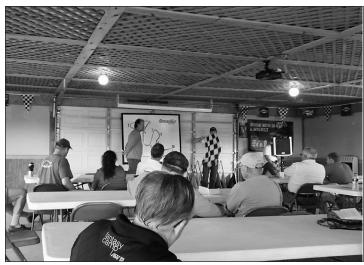

ROAR ON THE SHORE

Club Race & HPDE at GingerMan

have been many times to DEs at Waterford Hills Road racing, but I did not know what to expect with the Club Race and HPDE (High Performance Driver Education) at the same time on a different track. After a three-hour drive, we arrived Thursday afternoon at GingerMan Raceway in South Haven. To our surprise a lot of people were already there. We were greeted by President Howard Gilson, Race Chair Marc Molzon and his wife Lisa, Steve Carbary, Chief Driving Instructor for the weekend, Patti, Jerry and Amber Door and Shirley Carlisle. Amber was already in full registration mode and we were done with it quickly. After Victoria finished setting up the Goodie Store, we drove to our Bed & Breakfast, seven minutes away from the Race Track. We settled in and had dinner at Bangor Tavern Bar & Grille. After a glass of wine we called it a day.

At 7:00am Friday morning I left our quarters and went to the track for a coffee and the 8:00am classroom session, held by Marc Molzon and Steve Carbary. They explained the different colored flags, how to enter and exit the track and grid area. Interestingly we only had two HPDE run groups, which worked out perfectly after the first two sessions.

Now the fun started, at 9:00 am HPDE Group 1 was going out to run a 30 minute session, then HPDE Group 2 was running for 30 minutes and the racers did a test and tune session for 30 minutes. Then Group 1 was running another 30 minutes and so on. Besides a second classroom session and lunch break, you were on the track or getting ready for the track on the grid. At the end of the day most people had 150 minutes track time in the book.

Saturday was almost the same schedule, except the racers did

practice runs and drove the 1 hour Enduro Race. The HPDE participants were able to collect another 150 minutes of track time. On Sunday the racers had more practice sessions and two sprint races. The HPDE participants had the opportunity to collect more track time, 2 * 30 minute sessions and a 40 minute session. Overall you could collect 400 minutes of track time throughout the weekend, which equals out to a whole HPDE season at Waterford Hills.

In order to be allowed on the track, your instructor performs a grid inspection on your car. Tire pressure, torque on the wheel nuts, secure battery, signal and brake lights etc. And of course he checks if all lose items are removed from inside the car and trunk. You don't want to have anything flying around in the car while you are on the track under hard acceleration, cornering or braking.

This much of track time puts a lot of wear and tear on the machinery. Changing brake pads was not uncommon to see and help was everywhere, races as well as in the HPDE community. Alain Baur, for example, ran out of brake pads. Amber Door was trying to get some for her 2009 Boxster at a local dealer, but they were out of stock. "Johnson Autosport" Race Team helped Alain out with a fresh set of Pagid race brake pads.

I enjoyed the recently resurfaced track very much. On Friday I drove two sessions with instructor Dr. Gary Mason. First I had to learn the track and then we worked on my driving line and braking.

In the meantime, Victoria arrived and opened the Goodie Store. She presented some new items including Wine Glasses with an engraved Porsche Crest. The Goodie Store did very well

at the weekend, all Wine Glasses were sold ad she already has more on order.

After lunch I had three sessions with my original instructor Jeff Amos. We worked on smoothness, momentum and certain parts of the track. At the end of the first day I became very comfortable with the track and Jeff signed me off as a Solo Driver. In between our HPPDE session the racers tested and tuned their cars. If you were not getting something to drink or eat, you were definitely watching them. After the track day we went back to the Bed & Breakfast, took a shower and getting ready for dinner. The Blueberry Festival was in full swing in South Haven and all restaurants had at least an hour wait. We decided to go back to the Bangor Tavern Bar & Grille. It is located right on 43, on Michael Cohen's way to his hotel in Paw Paw. He joined us for dinner and we had some great ribs.

Looking forward for the Saturday activities to start, I was back at the track at 7:00am and the first HPDE car went out at 8:00 am. Again another great track day. Being right there with the racers, they on the track we on the grid. After they pulled off the track, we went right out on the track, a "Priceless" experience. Whenever I had time I was in the tower at race control to shadow Jeff Amos. It was very interesting to see how professional Jeff Amos handled the different situations during all the sessions and the race. He instructed the corner workers to show for example the yellow flag, black flag and the "meat ball" flag to the drivers. After our last Saturday HPDE the racers run their 1 hour Enduro race. At the end of the day we joined fellow HPDE enthusiasts, racers, volunteers and the National Club Race Staff at the Banquet. The food was catered by a local company and let me tell you, it was excellent and way too much. Instead of throwing the food away, Patti & Amber drove to Benton Habor and donated the leftover food to a Homeless Shelter. They were so thrilled that they put a banner with "Southeast Michigan Porsche Club" up!

Jerry Door and Leo Wanstreet volunteered to drive the Pace Car. Fortunately they were only busy during the warm-up laps before the "Flying Start."

It was very foggy on Sunday morning. When I arrived at the track the windows of my 993 were wet and foggy. On Sunday only the Solo Drivers HPDE group could go on the track. At 8:00 am we went out for our first session.

Because of the fog I thought the track would be slippery. I took it slow on the first lap. But surprisingly the grip was good and I laid some very nice and consistent laps down. After 30 minutes we departed the track and the race group rolled in for their warm-up session. Then the HPDE group went out for another 30 minute run. Then it was time for Sprint Race #1.

After the first race the Solo Driver HPDE Group went out on the track for another 40 minutes, the last HPDE track session for the weekend.

Lunch Time is Quiet Time at GingerMan, no race engines allowed, but regular engines are not a problem. On all 3 days people took their cars for Touring Laps during Lunch Break. Speed is limited and no helmet required. SEMPCA charged \$5 for Touring Laps per car. 100% of the proceeds went to our charity "Jo Brighton Special Olympics, Michigan".

I started to get the 993 ready for the trip home and Victoria packed the Goodie Store back into the BMW. Thanks to Howard for giving her a hand. Now it was time for the Race Group to run their second Sprint Race.

After the race Marc & Lisa handed out the awards to the Rac-

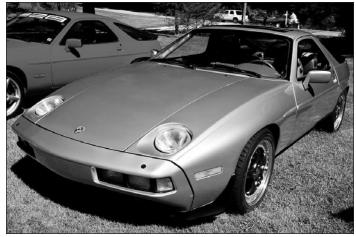

Favorite Roads

o you have a favorite road? Most car enthusiasts will have a road that holds special memories for them. Maybe your favorite road even makes a statement about who you are. Your favorite road may challenge your driving skills or may just be a scenic wonder. It may be a public road or even a race track. It may have been famous or a road only you know about. You may have only experienced the road once, on infrequent occasions or if you are very lucky your favorite road is used every day. Maybe it became your favorite road because you shared the experience with someone special. Maybe your favorite road gave you a special thrill or maybe it marked you with a moment of sheer terror. Your favorite road seldom stays the same forever. Favorite roads often get replaced over time with new favorite roads or just fade into imprecise memories. Favorite roads mark a period of time just like many other things that are special in our lives. They mark destinations and passages, milestones and memories. They are a reflection of our car culture and a metaphor for a passage through life.

Usually we can't describe a favorite road without relating it to the vehicle we used to transit that road. Usually it is related to a special car we owned, but not always. Sometimes that favorite road involved a car we shared with someone or even a nondescript rental. Sometimes it did not involve a car at all and sometimes the road was more a trail than a road. Usually the favorite road was linked to a specific destination but some very special roads are discovered by accident, or at least not by plan. Maybe the road is special because it was a once in a lifetime experience. Sometimes the road only becomes a favorite when looked back in retrospect or when recounted with friends. Swapping stories about favorite roads is part of the pleasures of having a favorite road.

Part of the treasure of a favorite road is the location. A favorite road in an exotic location adds to the exclusiveness and makes it more personal. On the other hand it makes that favorite road an experience that often can't be repeated. It may only exist for now in your memories. If you are lucky there are some pictures, or even better yet, a video. If you are very lucky you can close your eyes and visualize that favorite road whenever you need it. But one of the pitfalls of a favorite road is that it can change or even disappear over time. Progress has a habit of turning a favor-

ite road into a common place route. That favorite winding route from nowhere to no place special will became a major thoroughfare through a major population center with all of the associated clutter of homes, shopping centers and cross roads with their traffic controls. Your favorite road becomes hijacked by the passage of time and the progress of civilization. That loss forces us to ever search for replacement favorite



roads. That search, though it is pleasurable in itself, can push us out of our comfort zones and further and further away from home.

That leads naturally to how we keep track of our favorite roads. In simple times our favorite road was just a route we knew by heart. We didn't need so much as a map to find or describe it. As our favorite roads became linked to travel they needed to be defined by road names or route numbers. They often were roads made relevant by a city or perhaps a landmark. The road now became a place that could only be experienced with much planning and forethought. The thrills of that favorite road became shortened and the spontaneity of experiencing the road was dimmed. It may even reach the point where that favorite road is lost to just memories and to re-experience it becomes impossible. To even find our favorite road now requires Internet search engines with computer mapping and satellite images. We can know more than we ever did about our favorite road but that was not what had made it our favorite in the first place.

As travelers sharing a vast network of possible favorite roads the thrill is always that the next road we take may become that special favorite road. Perhaps that next road story we hear may spark us to begin our search anew. For some the search may be a solitary one. For others that thrill will come from sharing the favorite road with friends. In whatever form it takes our favorite road will make a statement about us, define some of our character, and shape some of our memories. I hope you find new favorite roads for the rest of your life.

Q: The timing belt tensioner pulley for my 1984 928 has a noisy bearing and I need a new one. First, I ordered one from the dealer. They told me that there were none in the country but they could order it from Germany. They said that if might take a week to ten days to get it. Not wanting to wait that long, I checked online. One of the well-known parts suppliers (I will call them "Stork") showed the part on their website in stock. Great! I ordered it from them and I was ready to pay for overnight freight (\$54.00) since I wanted the car back on the road for Sharks in Hell. The next day I got an email from Stork saying that shipment was delayed, the part was temporarily out of stock, but it would be shipped overnight as soon as they received it. They also said that if might take a week to ten days to get it from Porsche. This was a bit frustrating since the website showed it, but I guess someone beat me to it. So I called the dealer for a status report on the first pulley I ordered and they informed me that there were none available even in Germany! Now I am starting to get worried. I called Stork and asked when they expected to get the part in. I was told that the part was on back order from Germany and there was no expected arrival date. Now I am really starting to sweat.

I decided to cancel the overnight order from Stork since they could not get the part any faster than the dealer, it was the same price, then there was that \$54.00 overnight freight charge. When I called, they informed me that although they could cancel the order, I would have to pay a 20% restocking fee. I was astonished! They were going to charge me to restock a part they showed on their website, but did not have, could not get, and therefore, would not have to restock at all! The very nice customer service rep on the line said that she was sorry but that it was Stork policy. When I asked to speak to her boss, after a five minute wait she said that they would make an exception and cancel the order with no penalty. I will think twice before I call them again. So "with two out, bottom of the ninth", here I am, needing a part that no one currently has nor can get, and a car that I cannot put together. Help! —Don

A: Ah, the world of online parts. Clearly the site was not updated when you placed your order but holy cow...a restock fee for a part they could not sell you? I know who you are talking about and I

am very surprised to hear about that policy, but it is a very creative way of making a profit by just taking an order.

I need to put a plug in here for the local Porsche dealers. I have found them helpful and fair in their pricing (usually) and very eager to track parts that I order. When I get a part shipped from Germany, there is no extra freight and they deliver the part to my door. I recently bought a new front fender for a 930 Turbo which came from Germany in a giant box and it was no big deal. The on-line suppliers get many of their genuine Porsche parts from dealers and then they resell them at Porsche retail plus freight. The point is, if you want a genuine part, call the dealer and get their price. Some give club discounts and if you can wait for a stock order, there is no freight charge. Dealers sometimes get a bad rap for being expensive but they have rent to pay like any business. So give them a shot at selling you the part and definitely compare pricing. There was a time where some dealers charged more than Porsche suggested retail then took the club discount off the inflated price. Tricky!

But I digress. You need a pulley, the world cannot help you, and you are eager to get back on the road. Auto companies generally do not make many of the components which comprise the car and your 928 is no different. In some cases, a generic pulley can be purchased at a local auto parts store which will function quite nicely and live just as long as an original part. You take the sample part to the parts store and frequently they can match it up. If they can't, then you have to get creative. Tensioner pulleys have a bearing and an outer structure or shell, which is sometimes proprietary. However, if you look at the existing bearing in your tensioner pulley, there is a part number on the bearing and that bearing can be sourced. So that part of the process is do-able. Next, the Motor City has an abundance of qualified machine shops that do small jobs like fabricating a pulley and most independent shops know who they are. The fabricated part needs to have a bearing of sufficient quality to function properly and the material used must be stronger than the original metal when possible.

The last pulley that I had fabricated was solid steel rather than a stamping and the bearing used was the same part number. It took about three days to locate the components and have it made.

When all was said and done, it was about the same cost as buying the part from Porsche, just a lot more aggravating. So when the part can be bought you buy it and when it can't, you build it. The Motor City is full of creative people and resources are not hard to find. —MC

Q: My 1993 RS America has had an intermitting starting and occasional stalling problem for years and I am about at my wits end with it. I have had components tested, replaced a few and, for a while, it seems better but every once and a while, it just will not fire up. I have replaced the DME relay, had the grounds checked

and replaced one of the speed/reference sensors and whenever things are tested, everything works!. Got any ideas? —Robin

A: I have seen solder joints fail in the DME computer which have driven me crazy and although I do not recommend that you try this at home, suggest to your favorite Porsche technician that he take the computer out of the car, remove the guts and take a very careful look at it with a magnifying glass. If he finds spots on the circuit board that look questionable, a competent electronics specialist can re-solder these and that may do the trick. Let me know if it works —MC
