Long Term Build

For a lot of Porsche owners their car starts off as a blank canvas for what they envision is the perfect car. Of course the car is perfect as it stands, but especially after it is owned for several years there is the quest to make changes to improve it for one's personal tastes. Unless you have no patience at all, this quest will span many years with many incremental changes. If you have no patience there is always the retro or resto mod versions offered by specialty builders like Singer. But, if you are looking for the personalized or unique Porsche you build your dream car over a period of many years using special upgrades as you find them. I think this was the case for me with every Porsche I have owned. Given enough years and enough modifications you may find that there are actually few original parts left on your car. Also, given enough years you may find that there are just no modifications left to be made. In which case, there is motivation to start over with a new blank canvas. Very seldom does one start over with a car already well along in the modification process. After all, this is a personal quest and the vision is very personal. And why isn't the original version satisfactory? There just doesn't seem to be a clear answer to that question.


As I said, every one of my Porsches has been subject to modification, some more successfully than others. Beginning with my first Porsche, a 914-6 it was a very perfect car even in its original form. The only problem was that every other 914-6 looked and ran just like my car did. Something had to be done to mark it as my own, with some minor suspension and engine changes I was infinitely more satisfied. The replacement was a 911S Targa which would seem to be perfect as it was. But, back to that same problem that all 911S Targa are alike and I was motivated to change just one or two suspension upgrades to make it even better. The replacement for the 911S was a new 911E coupe, a truly blank canvas. My only problem was that over the years I came across parts that would make incremental improvements. Little things like European marker lenses and headlights were added. Then things got much more complicated and expensive, like a full Carrera set of fenders and bumpers plus a duck tail spoiler, fuel tank and ultimately a correct 2.7 dual spark plug engine. The line had been crossed and there was no going back. Whenever a Carrera RS part showed up on the market I had to add it to the car. Ultimately it became a full blown Carrera RS tribute car and there was nothing left to add. At that point there are just two options, sell it and start over or keep it and look for the next blank canvas to start over.


The other long term project that lasted over a decade was quite the opposite of the 911. Instead of modifying a complete running car, I started with a half-finished race car project with the objective of turning it into a factory correct street car. The car was a 914-6 GT starting out with a racing car chassis, but not much else. It even lacked the race engine and transmission. But, since I had the vision of what I wanted it to become I had the blank sheet of paper I wanted. All I needed to do was collect dozens of factory correct parts and find the shop or shops I needed to complete it. As I would find the parts each one became one more step to the completed car. Time was on my side as I already had my Carrera. I also had a 356B coupe that needed to be sold to provide the build money and the build space in my garage. I finally finished the last details on my own. I had created a 914-6 GT just as the factory would have created it. The only problem was the 2.8 race motor and short gear ratio transmission made the car ideal for a race track, but less than ideal for the road. I ended up with a trailer to take it to the track, plus a tow vehicle. It became my primary track car, but only a very occasional street car. As my wife would put, it I had a two car museum that never had visitors. The end of the project had come and the choice had to be made whether to keep it or move on. I ended up selling it to the proper owner who would appreciate it as the car he was looking for. I moved on to an opportunistic find in a totally different direction, a used 1999 Corvette that was the precursor to the Z06. That led me to my current stable of the Carrera RS and a 2007 Corvette Z06, which is often described as a race car with a passenger seat that needs zero upgrades, so far.

The days of project cars are finally over. I don't regret any of it, although I am not sure I would do it all over again. ■
