



Wheel Alignment

Wheel alignment at first consideration would seem to be a very simple problem to solve. After all there are only four wheels and three axes to control, camber or top to bottom tilt of the wheel, toe the inward or outward pointing of the wheel and castor the angle of the wheel relative to the ground. These dimensions are applied independently to each wheel, act in concert with each other and dynamically in reaction to forces applied to the wheel based on an operator's inputs and road reactions. How complicated could that be? As it turns out it is almost infinitely complicated. The measurement and adjustments are also almost infinitely complicated and at the same time critical to efficient and safe operation. It also requires very specialized tools and very specialized mechanical skills.

Different alignment settings have different consequences on the driving feel and car response to driving situations. To begin with, the alignment settings that your Porsche originally came with are more than adequate for the majority of driving that will occur. Porsche engineers have to take into account not only how the majority of driving will occur, but also the safest possible outcomes that the car will be subject to by the average driver. That's right, Porsche knows that their owners are for the most part better drivers than the average and they set up the handling of the Porsches to take that into account. But, at the same time handling can be optimized to increase feedback and make the car more enjoyable and predictable to drive. Being informed enthusiasts we often want to change the suspension set up to bias it toward different performance objectives such as occasional track use. Any modifications usually end up being a compromise of some sort. Setting the suspension to racing specifications usually results in an uncomfortable or even unsafe street driving handling. If the car is never street driven and is towed on a trailer to track events you may not consider the optimized set up to be an issue. Also be prepared to accept sometimes extreme suspension and tire wear which may be acceptable on a race car, but not so much on a street driven car. The other consideration of car suspension set up is the tires that are being used. On a race car it is acceptable and even expected that the tire wear will be excessive. It is quite normal that tires will lose their performance over short distances of even less than 100 miles. Race cars usually have suspension setting checked and modified almost every time they hit the track. Every competent race team owns their own alignment set up rig and often dedicates mechanics specifically to suspension set up. For anything less than a dedicated race car this would be unacceptable. Yet in the quest for the optimum performing car, many manufacturers are willing to use tires with very short wear life to provide handling performance better than the competition can deliver. Considering the low miles that are usually put on most high performance cars this may be acceptable. Also consider that given the low use it is quite likely that performance tires will age out their four year safe life expectancy long before the tread disappears.

Production cars have suspension settings that are combinations of compromises trading off wear against comfort, safety and performance. A standard suspension set up for a Porsche biases these settings toward performance, but also consistency that results in being able to extract a higher level of performance with feedback. This ensures being able to extract performance in a confidence inspiring manner. Again, it considers that driving skills are only reached with driver confidence. Any erratic chassis reaction makes it very difficult to explore handling limits with any degree of repeatability. Throw in road irregularities and it is an accident waiting to happen or at a minimum much more excitement than desired or intended.


That is precisely why most good suspension set ups have a mild degree of under steer built in. The same goes for wheel toe in on the front and rear wheels. Understand that the range of motion that wheels go through is not linear by design. Engineers design wheel travel to optimize the contact patch of the tire through many variables of vehicle pitch and roll as well as dive and squat on braking and acceleration. Spring rates and shock absorbing settings can have just as large effect on suspension settings as tire pressure setting have. Negative camber or leaning the tire into a corner can increase cornering grip, but be assured that there are serious consequences on tire performance and wear.

If you are going to deviate from OEM manufacturer suspension settings you should be aware of the consequences of the newly compromised settings. Better yet, take advantage of the knowledge of the mechanic that you use. In my opinion mechanics with race experience are excellent sources of what works and what doesn't. For an example, Tim Pott is a very successful 914 racer. When I sought help with my 914-6 GT it already had chassis and suspension modifications adapted for racing. With alignment settings performed by Tim, it became a phenomenal performing track car. Since I trailered the car to and from the track I could mount racing tires and accept rapid tread wear. On my 1972 Carrera RS tribute I had many track optimized suspension components, but I intended to do mostly street driving with occasional track outings. Road manners and tread life were of some consideration. In that case, I used Howard Gilson to create an easy to drive optimized set up.

Suspension setting has an enormous impact on how much we enjoy driving our cars. Dedicating our energy and awareness toward setting and maintenance is invaluable.







Las Vegas to the Canyon: A Road Trip through the Desert

Sin City.

24/7 lights, booze, gambling, and other unmentioned forms of debauchery. It's also in close proximity to two amazing southwestern landmarks and is worth a desert road trip. Upon landing at Harry Reid International Airport, I flagged a cab to my hotel on the Vegas Strip. In past visits, I've always loved the Wynn, however this trip I decided for a change of scenery and checked into the Aria Hotel. After dinner at Joe's Seafood in the Forum Shops at Caesars Palace for stone crabs, it was time to head back to my room for a restful evening.

I awakened the next morning energized by the rising sun over the surrounding mountains. Around 9 am, I headed to Enterprise Exotics to pick up a 2023 Porsche 911 Carrera Cabriolet. The rental facility was just 1.5 miles from the strip and the onsite representative Paul was very accommodating. After some brief small talk, Paul – noting I was a long time Porsche owner, gave me 150 free miles and knocked 50% off any over mileage. It felt better than being dealt an ace and face card in blackjack! Now the real adventure was about to begin.

I made a left onto Flamingo Blvd and headed to I-215 E to jump on southbound US 93. The scenery got pretty spectacular as I headed past Henderson towards Boulder City. Traffic was light, the weather a bit cool, but no worries. The sun was beaming and the roar of the twin turbocharged flat-six in the 992 had me grinning! After a 36-minute drive and pulling into an overlook or two, I reached Exit 2 for the Hoover Dam Access Rd.

After passing through a security checkpoint (no drones nor firearms allowed), I parked the P-car and climbed stairs (there's also a ramp) to proceed to the Mike O'Callaghan-Pat Tillman Memorial Bridge. Situated above the Colorado River, the bridge is a pretty breathtaking sight, carrying US 93 over the river. It also connects Nevada to Arizona. Being on the pedestrian viewing area next to the roaring traffic on the highway is a bit surreal and unnerving. Once on the viewing portion, you can literally walk to both neighboring states.

There's a tourist center and the dam itself is an engineering marvel. Looking down onto the largest reservoir in the U.S., Lake Mead is astounding. The lake provides water to AZ, NV, CA and parts of Mexico. The view from the pedestrian bridge gives one a bird's eye view that is astonishing. I soon headed back to the car to drive around the canyons encircling the dam. Lots of twisties and incredible scenery, but I was careful – it was still not time to drop the cab's top because of the potential for falling rocks!

Back on US 93, I was soon in AZ, the Grand Canyon State. I continued for 57 miles and made a left onto Pierce Ferry Road in Dolan Springs, population 1,994. This was a fun road that allowed the 992's personality to really come to life. Passing the Dolan Springs Post office, I continued for 16 miles while paying attention to signs warning of cattle.

After stopping for gas and a leg stretch, it was time to let the top down! What a perfect day for open air motoring. I made a right onto Diamond Bar Road, which was one of the highlights of the drive. This road is a Porsche driver's aspiration. Lots of cork screws, blind curves and elevation changes, all while thundering through canyons. Each approaching curve surpassed the previous. Don't miss the Joshua Tree Forest. Pure driving rapture at its best.

After 17 minutes on Diamond Bar, I reached the security roundabout for Grand Canyon West. I checked into the Welcome Center where bus and helicopter tours, as well as white water rafting excursions are available. The west rim is situated on an Indian reservation, home of the Hualapai People. I took the bus to the skywalk, a glass bridge 4000 feet above the canyon. Skip the pricey photos, the bus will make a second stop where one can explore the red rocks by foot. Pictures don't begin to describe this wonder. The beauty of the canyon is simply stunning.

It was now time to head back to Las Vegas. My adrenaline started to pump at the thought of the roads I would encounter on my way back to US 93 north. Heading back towards Dolan Springs, I passed the Joshua trees, Hot Diggety Dog (a roadside restaurant that serves beef hot dogs w/nacho cheese), the local trading post and post office. As I arrived back in Vegas, I dropped the car off on Flamingo Road at the rental facility. Five hours round trip and only 18 miles over mileage.

Back at the hotel, I grabbed a burger and fries at Aria's Posh Burger. A couple of margaritas and a half hour or so at the blackjack table, I was ready to call it a day.
