Super Light

The latest LeMans 24 hour was recognized as the 100th running of this iconic race. Porsche has held a stranglehold on this race; winning more than any other marquee in various classes as well as overall victories. Porsche got its start as a car company by entering two cars in the very first 24 Hour and winning its class. The car that was entered was the 356 SL or Super Light. That got me wondering just what this car was and how have successive Porsche racing cars evolved from a weight perspective.

The 1949 356 Gmund Coupe was so known because it was built in the original sawmill building in Gmund, Austria. I have visited that building and the small size belies the enormous heritage. Original Gmund Coupes were made from aluminum which contributes to the super light designation. Aluminum was chosen more for its ability to be formed over wooden bucks. With only 40 horsepower from its 1,300 cc engine and wheel spats covering the front wheels combined with the low weight of only 1,747 pounds it could reach a competitive 100 miles per hour top speed. The next competitive racer was the aluminum bodied America Roadster, competition ready sans bumpers and windshield it weighed `just 1,246 pounds. By 1959 the 356 A Carrera had grown to 1,949 pounds in street form.

Early race cars like the aluminum bodied RS 60 were a featherweight 1,322 pounds. The more modern series of fiberglass bodied race cars started with the 904 at 1.904 pounds. The big leap was the 917 at only 1,972 pounds. The 908 ws considered as light weight but it came in at 1,905 pounds. What was an amazingly light car were the mountain climb cars like the 909 at an amazing 963 pounds. Of course the reason these weights seem so similar is that strict racing class rules govern minimum weight. The Can Am series had much more radical rules such that the 917 PS or first iteration weighed only1,736 pounds almost the same as the king of 917 models the 917-30 at only 1,797 pounds. In comparison the only Indy Porsche weighed just 1,524 pounds. If this seems light consider that the last 935, the Moby Dick weighed 2, 297 pounds. In strict contrast it was developed from an amazing chapter in Porsche racing. The German DRM series was being contested by the BMW 318i and the Ford Capri. Porsche challenged its engineers to develop a class winning car to theses strict 2 liter class rules.

They started with a Group 5 935 and reduced the weight to an amazing 1,620 pounds and a 1.4 liter turbo six with 320 horsepower. The car named the "Baby" won one race and with point proved it was retired to the museum. But not before Kremer Racing borrowed the car to develop its own dominating 935 K3.

I have always favored owning light weight Porsches. The original 901 in 1963 weighed 2,420 pounds compared to the last 356C of that year at 2.094 pounds. By 1967 the 911S was only 2,183 pounds. The racing version of the 911, the ST/GT was only 2,151 pounds. The 1973 Carrera RS light weight was only 2,150 pounds. The racing 914-6 GT was only 1,808 pounds I weighed my own 914-6 GT street version at 1,860 pounds on the racing scales at Watkins Glen where on the same scales my Carrera RS tribute weighed in at 2,170 pounds. The original weight of a 1972 911E was only 2,480 pounds and the original 914-6 was only 2,195 pounds. The lightest Turbo was the 1976 930 at 2,800 pounds, in rear drive only.

Moving to the more modern era the 1976 936 was a very light 1,568 pounds. The very complex 1989 959 was an almost hefty 2,977 pounds. The 1982 956 was much lighter 1,837 pounds with its light carbon fiber and aluminum chassis. A 2023 street GT3RS weighs 3,268 pounds and the 718 Spyder RS comes in at 3,214 pounds. The latest race cars like the 2005 Spyder RS weigh 1,819 pounds. The most current race cars like the 2015 919 weighs 1,920 pounds and the 963 hyper cars come in at 2,270 pounds. Those are actually amazingly light considering the complexity of added electric motors and huge battery packages. The current Carrera S weighs 3,142 pounds and this is sure to get heavier as they move to electric hybrid versions.

Does weight make a difference in driving feel? I like to think it does In terms of responsiveness. I certainly enjoy driving my relatively light weight 911 even though in power to weight ratios the new cars are far superior.



I'll bet there were some Steve McQueens just waiting to put the pedal to the metal.

Remarks were overheard that some people did not know about Waterford Hills Road Racing and they were pleased to find out about it. Others said they had been coming out to the track for over thirty years. You can learn more about the track at waterfordhills.com. There are two more weekends of racing in August and September. SEM will also have two more Drivers Education (HPDE) sessions this year. Hopefully you will enjoy one of these events in the near future.
