

Brake Rotors

The invention of the brake rotor goes back much farther than you would think. The first mechanical brake disk system was fitted in 1898. It was mounted on the front wheels of the American Electric vehicle built by Elmer Ambrose Sperry of Cleveland. The earliest brake system was wood blocks applied against the wheel rim or the tire. But by 1890, rubber tires made wood blocks obsolete due to excessive wear. In 1902, Louis Renault created the drum brake. The disk brake appeared shortly after in 1902 by William Lanchester and the modern brake shoes in 1905 by Englishman Herbert Frood. The first American disk brakes appeared on the 1949 Crosley Hotshot, but were dropped the following year for being too expensive of an option. Disk brakes continued to be fitted to trains and airplanes. The most notable automotive adaptions of disk brakes appeared in 1960 by Lancia followed by Mercedes in 1961, Renault in 1962, Nissan in 1963 and Volvo in 1966. But, what everyone remembers is when disk brakes were fitted to the racing Jaguar D Type for their victories at LeMans in 1951 and 1952. Disk brakes were credited for beating Ferrari when that team's cars were still fitted with drum brakes. The first four wheel disk brakes on a production sports car was the 1953 Austin Healey 100S. The first American sports car with four wheel disk brakes was the 1963 Corvette.

Brake disks are usually made from cast grey iron. But the composition of the grey iron will vary based on the mixtures of alloy used in the casting process. Rotor disks may be solid or cast as two surfaces separated by internal vanes which direct the air from the center hub to the outer edges. Other rotor compositions may be steel or the latest variant of carbon ceramic. Rotor surfaces may be drilled in order to dissipate gas build up, to allow for water dissipation or even to shave away any buildup of brake pad material that may transfer to the rotor surface. Another variant is the floating disk rotor which mounts the disk to the hub with a series of floating pins. This allows for the expansion and shrinkage of the rotor from heat and prevents warping.

Rotor size has a high impact on brake effectiveness by increasing the swept area of the rotor. For many years rotor size depended on the wheel circumference since the disk was fitted inside the wheel rim. Racing variants included mounting the disk external to the wheel such as next to the transmission with the caliper mounted to the chassis rather than the axle hub. One disadvantage was in ducting cooling air to these inboard disks as well as transferring heat to inboard components. One early Porsche variant gripped the brake rotor from the inside rather than the outside. This was dropped because it had poor heat transfer to the caliper which also serves as a heat sink to dissipate brake heat.

Carbon ceramic rotors were first developed for the British TGV high speed trains in 1988. Dunlop developed ceramic brakes for the supersonic Concord passenger jets for their very high speed landings. Dunlop adopted these brake disks for the Brabham F1 team in 1976 and now they are standard use combinations of carbon disks and carbon brake pads. These take hundreds of hours to manufacture and are used up in one race weekend. They have a very narrow operating temperature range and require careful warming up before they are effective. Production car carbon/carbon disk and pad options for the street have a very specific and high cost material composition that are highly effective in high speed braking and racing applications. The added advantage of being relatively light weight is offset by their brittle nature as any small imperfection in the disk surface can cause rotor failure and thousands of dollars in replacement cost. In fact, Porsche recommends that owners of these ceramic systems swap to cast iron brakes for cars used in high performance drivers' education events.

It is important to note that these are called brake systems for a good reason. Engineers match brake system components from master cylinders, to brake lines, brake calipers, brake pads, and even electronic monitors such as speed sensors used for measuring brake rotor speeds of antilock systems. While it is very tempting to swap out parts, it can lead to unintended effects such as a loss in brake performance.

Like most Porsche components, it is easy to see how much development and innovation has occurred over the generations. What is available in the current generation of Porsches is nothing short of amazing.


