



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M1-Woodward Avenue is a highway notably referred to as Detroit's Main Street and follows the route of the old Saginaw Trail that linked Detroit with Pontiac, and at the time, Flint and Saginaw.


Woodward Avenue was created after a devastating fire in 1805 and is one of five principal avenues in Detroit devised by Augustus B. Woodward as part of a street plan intended to make Detroit the Paris of the West, by emulating it's wide avenues.

Woodward Avenue was the location of the first mile of concrete roadway in the entire country and in 1970, bore the M1 designation. Woodward Avenue is synonymous with cruising.

By 1958, Woodward Avenue was the place to be for unofficial car racing and today continues to celebrate Detroit's automotive history with a Dream Cruise, taking place during August of each year.





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

# You Would Not Understand

As car enthusiasts and especially as Porsche enthusiasts, it is easy to think we understand each other. After all just look at how much we have in common. Well, the more I hang out with my fellow Porsche enthusiasts the more I realize that I really don't understand how much we share. Take the most common aspect about which Porsche we own or at least prefer. With all of the models of Porsche offered, it is quite likely we can't even find common ground in that. Sure we can say we prefer the Porsche we currently own but even that isn't a given. With each new model that is offered, do we really prefer the one we own or would we rather upgrade to a newer model if we could afford it? What is more accurate is that most of us get really attached to a specific year, model or even a very specific car. We often tend to get attached to a specific Porsche along with any of its shortcomings. Once in a while we can get nostalgic about a particular car we used to own. Maybe we sold it because it seemed like a good idea at the time only to look back at the decision and regret it. Also just as often we look back at the car we had with some misjudged feelings or memories. Maybe the one we used to own was in reality full of problems and shortcomings, but fondness makes us forget what we had. If we are a particular fanatical enthusiast we might even have the luxury of just adding to our collection.

In some cases, we become a very specialized kind of enthusiast. We might have a Porsche for a specific purpose, such as a track day car or even a race car. We might have a more practical approach and have one of the SUV or luxury models or to get really trendy we might have a hybrid electric. Perhaps we get hung up on nostalgia and prefer a classic of one vintage over another. If you have been an enthusiast long enough, you may have been lucky enough to have experienced several different vintages and models from both the air cooled and water cooled eras. If you are an owner of an early vintage car the chances are you iust don't understand how vou could move on to a new air cooled model or to one of the newer water cooled models. In that case, how will you be able to reconcile moving on to a totally electric model?

So even though we all can categorize ourselves as Porsche enthusiasts, we probably don't really understand how we can be so different while at the same time having so much in common. Our diversity goes far beyond the car and into our enthusiasts' life styles. We enjoy our Porsche in so many different ways, not only in how we drive our cars but also in how we interact with each other. At the same time our diversity of interests is what makes our club so special and our members special and unique as well. We don't have to all enjoy the same interests to enjoy each other's company. We can respect our specific car enthusiasm and grow in the shared experiences. # **Student Perspective** - Kyle Bohr

### Classroom

The classroom experience was interesting and easy to understand. There was a presentation and videos by Tire Rack. The instructor talked about vehicle dynamics such as oversteer and understeer. They also covered how to identify when your tire tread is too low and other topics.

# Driving

Before Street Survival School I had never actually pushed a car harder than normal street driving. There were seven different courses to participate on. They included a skid pad/figure 8, slalom/emergency lane change, plus braking and autocross courses. It was really fun participating on the different course setups. I learned the feeling of the car when oversteering/understeering, with the abs kicking in under emergency braking and weight shifting during emergency turns. It got even better during the autocross course, which put all of the day's lessons to use.

The autocross course started with a left, right chicane, it then turned into a long lefthander. After a small straight there was a right turn that led to a three point slalom. At the end of the slalom there was a left turn that led to the end of the course. All of the day's courses helped me learn the skills needed to properly drive the autocross course at speed and it was extremely fun!

### Overall

Before the school I was concerned that it was going to be stressful, but it ended up being really fun and I enjoyed the experience. The instructors were kind and patient and it made it more enjoyable. I was the student one there with a manual transmission vehicle. Having a manual transmission added an extra level of challenge to the day and made it even more interesting.


# <u>Instructor Perspective</u> - Chris Bohr

This year, Tire Rack Street Survival School was held on November 4th at the American Center for Mobility. The ACM is a 500-acre Proving Ground for connected, autonomous and EV vehicles located at the west end of Willow Run Airport. This was our first year there and it is an extremely nice facility that gave us plenty of room to set up the driving courses and a large garage to hold the classroom sessions in. This year was another well attended event. Twenty-two students participated, we even had students come in from out of state to take part. Nineteen instructors (bravely) volunteered to help the students through the day's activities.

The weather started out overcast with moisture early in the morning that dried out through the day. The additional room at the ACM facility allowed for a safer and more controlled environment as we were able to space out and keep cross traffic to a minimum. All the students took to the courses well. They were open to instruction and learned quickly. There was a wide variety of vehicles used during the training. The students are instructed to bring their daily drivers and we saw sedans, hatchbacks, vans, SUVs and EVs being driven. The big event of the day is the autocross course at the end. This is the chance for the students to put to use all of their learnings from the day's six classes into one session. This helps reinforce everything the students learned during the training and allows them to feel their growth while enjoying a less stressful training environment. Thank you Marc and Lisa Molzon for coordinating this event, along with all the other instructors and parent volunteers that helped make this year's Tire Rack Street Survival School another success!

# Holiday Light Festival Tour





Dale walked from his home everyday to run his small business and provide for his family. Somehow he just knew where to go and did that until he passed away in 2018. 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
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# Treffen Gateway to the West (continued)
