# Mishing you a safe holiday season Wherever your travels may take you





### Favorite Roads





A popular enthusiast thrill is to drive a well-known stretch of very challenging road. Many of you have heard of them, if not driven on them. Our club has offered trips on an annual basis to places such as route 555 in Ohio (84 miles long), otherwise known as The Triple Nickel, or the road to Hocking Hills also in Ohio (26 miles long). Another famous route is the Tail of the Dragon in Tennessee at 11 miles long with 318 curves. A classic and famous route is the road to Pikes Peak, Colorado which is now a fully paved public road that is 12.42 miles long with 156 turns and an elevation climb of 4,730 feet. For lengthy tours, you could drive the Blue Ridge Parkway which connects Roanoke National Park in Virginia to the Great Smokey Mountain National Park in Gatlinburg, North Carolina. This 469 mile stretch of road is a 15 hour drive. Unfortunately, the recent hurricane has resulted in an indefinite closure of the whole road as many sections were washed away in the intense flooding. Personally, my favorite drive was the road to Hanna on Maui, which is 64 miles long with 620 curves and 59 narrow bridges. Once you get to the end, you have to turn around and drive the same road back to town. Talk about a driving work out, but the views make it well worth the effort.

Of course if you are not into one of these specific drives, I can heartily recommend one of the tours designed by one of our own members with meticulous care to cover spectacular Michigan back roads in just one afternoon. I have participated in many decades worth of these events and have never been disappointed. There are an amazing number of great roads in Michigan. I am sure all of us have found many such routes, which over the years have become our favorites. Some may be in our own backyards such as the Clinton River Road, which parallels the twisting Clinton River, just minutes from my house and one I drive almost daily. Combined with a handful of connecting roads, they become my own personal entertaining route that can be completed in less than an hour with minimal stops. When I worked in downtown Detroit, I found a series of connecting exit and entry ramps on the freeways that I could negotiate on a lunch break. Or for more adventure, I could drive to Belle Isle and loop through the tree lined connecting roads in the middle of the park's nature drives. The point is that we have more favorite roads than we think and have enjoyed over the years.

But, my true favorite roads are the many race tracks I have driven. I have always contended that race tracks rival any public road that has ever been traveled. Race tracks take any series of curves and straight sections to the extreme in terms of challenging driving. That is their exact purpose all while providing a measure of safety that no public road can offer. It is obvious that trees along the sides of a road are the ultimate unforgiving deterrent to safety. Track run off areas, guardrails and gravel traps are always preferable ways to prevent driving errors from turning into disasters. Add that to the fact that safety equipment is always readily available, instead of a phone call away. Another consideration also always has to be public access roads with driveways and limited visibility of the road or even corners. I have driven many roads which had severe drop offs or lack a shoulder at the pavement edges, which adds a high measure of danger to any driving error. Of course, I highly recommend one of our club's HPDE events to hone your driving skills before you take on some of these driving challenges. I also highly recommend that you get very good at driving our local tracks like Waterford, Gingerman and Gratten before you progress to high speed tracks like Watkins Glen, Mid-Ohio and Road America.

Wherever your favorite roads are, please remember to keep safety first, obey all traffic laws and always drive well within yours and the roads limitations.


2025 will be Dr. Porsche's 116th birthday and we expect to have another tour to celebrate the event. Until then.







### Fall Up North Overnight Tour

It has been a few years since SEM PCA has taken a trip Up North. The intent of this two day trip was to be a "Rallye" style trip, we spent one night in Mackinaw City and the other night in Traverse City. The main draw of this trip was to drive the Tunnel of Trees and M-22 along with other back roads. Fifteen vehicles and 24 people joined us for this event. The colors were very patchy during the trip, but most people were just happy that there were still leaves on the trees.

The start location for the event was in Highland. We met Friday at a Speedway station near the US-23 and M-59 interchange for a caravan up to Mackinaw City. We departed by 12:30 PM and the caravan consisted of 12 vehicles. We headed north on US-23 to Standish for our first stop. As usual in MI, we hit a bit of construction around Flint. The construction slow down proved to only be a small delay. The first stop was at a very nice Shell station in Standish. We were able to quickly make the stop and continue on. The caravan continued on heading north on M-65 through the Huron National Forest. The park was very picturesque around every corner, so much so that we were left disappointed when we needed to turn off of M-65.

It's definitely a much better route north than I-75 if you have the time. After leaving the park we headed east on M-32 to Alpena. In Alpena, we had our second stop also at a Shell station. The third and final stretch of the day had us traveling north on US-23 along the lakes to Mackinaw City. There were several great spots along the road where we could see several of the lakes including Long Lake, Grand Lake and Lake Huron. From our first stop all the way up to Mackinaw City the views were magnificent. We arrived at Baymont by Wyndam in Mackinaw City by 5:30 PM and checked in for the evening. The majority of the group went on a walk to dinner at The Hook, a seafood restaurant. The Hook had a great view of Lake Huron. On the way back we stopped to take a look at Mack-A-Tron before we retired for the evening at the hotel.

Saturday morning we headed out at 8 AM. We stayed together as one group of 15 vehicles with two leads, the first and middle cars, plus a sweeper. The goal was to get to the Tunnel of Trees on M-119 before it got busy. The group headed south on M-31, then turned right on Levering Rd. We entered M-119 on the north end at Cross Village. We proceeded south through the Tunnel of Trees for 20










mile with little to no traffic. The Tunnel of Trees is a tight 1.5 car wide road that bobs and weaves through a dense forest along Lake Michigan. The trees are so dense there are several long stretches where you cannot see the sky above. Even though the colors were just starting to change, we were treated to a great view all the way through. It was quite the experience being able to drive the Tunnel of Trees with no slowdowns or stoppages. Next we headed south to Boyne City for a stop, of course at a Shell station. After the stop we headed to Boyne Falls to drive the roads south of Boyne Mountain Resort. Even though we were a bit disappointed to leave M-65 for M32 on Friday, today was a different story. M-32 just south of Boyne Mountain is a very winding road with large elevation changes. We turned off of M-32 just south of East Jordan and headed to Torch Lake on Old State Road. We were able to get several views of the hills and sweeping roads. As we arrived at Torch Lake we turned left and headed south down the east side of the lake. Torch Lake Drive was another densely tree lined twisty road. Next up were some twisty roads on the southeast side of Traverse City. We drove on Rennie Lake Rd. and Hobbs Highway around Rennie and Spider Lakes. North Four Mile Road took us to our lunch stop at Red Mesa, a Mexican restaurant, in Traverse City. We arrived at noon and Red Mesa provided the group a semi-private room. The lunch portions were large and fairly priced. We departed Red Mesa at 2:15 PM to start the Saturday afternoon drive. We knew before we left that the traffic would break the group up. We set up a rally point after the construction zone to get everyone back together, at least we were supposed to, but Traverse City traffic had another idea though. Google maps routed half the group around the construction traffic while the other half went through it. This quickly turned what was supposed to be the easiest part of the day to the hardest. We were able to collect a majority of the group just outside of town where M-22 began. We were able to get in touch with the other missing attendees and agreed to meet at the top of M-22 in Northport, at least that was the idea. As we headed north on M-22 to Northport there were great views of Grand Traverse and Northport Bays. At Northport I missed the left turn to continue on M-22, foliage was thick and obstructed the view of the turn. As we attempted to backtrack to the missed turn, the foliage continued to cause trouble as a majority of the group ended up heading back down the way we just came! As the lead car, I pulled over with a few cars behind me and waited. A few minutes later the sweeper showed up without the rest of the cars. The good news is the leads had radios and were able to communicate with one another. The spot I stopped in did not have mobile coverage. We decided to drive on to find a better signal to contact the other leads. The group

was able to gather back up not much later in Leland.





The first time I saw aero was probably on the cover of Import Tuner magazine. In those days, they were referred to as "body kits". These kits were added on to enhance the body and style of the car. The body kits from this era started with the import scene, originating in the 1970s. Looking back into history, these were not the first body kits known to the car world. I am not sure if they were called body kits in the 50s, but American Hot Rodders would modify their vehicles for looks and aerodynamics, as well as for drag racing down the boulevard!

On the other hand, I grew up with Japanese cars. I remember some of the first cars that were in my family, a Toyota pickup truck and a Toyota Corolla. Not only were they reliable, but they were also extremely affordable. When the opportunity for my first car came around, my parents helped me buy a Honda Civic EX even though I was lusting over the Acura Integra Type R. Due to affordability, safety, plus the additional \$20,000 I did not have, I ended up with the Civic.

The Honda Civic was the first car I modified. Wheels, exhaust and yes, a "body kit". From those days forward I have never called it anything different and always referred to any body part added onto a car as a "body kit."

Fast forward to today and the only word I hear is "aero" in online forums, through social media and in all the Euro magazine articles I have read. Why is this? Is this a generational term change? Or, is it because I have moved onto a different scene?

In 2020, I purchased a 2003 Porsche 911 Carrera. No longer was I in the Japanese world that I was so familiar with. Something was different. Everyone referred to additional body components on a car as "aero". Not once did anyone refer to them as a "body kit".

The word, "aero", is short for "aerodynamics". Google defines aerodynamics as "of or having shape which reduces the drag from air moving past", this makes total sense. In the Porsche world, there is nothing added onto the body that does not serve some type of function. Front bumpers, side skirts (which in this world are also called "rocker panels", we can get into this in another article), rear bumpers, wings and hoods. Everything is there for a purpose, to reduce drag for proper aerodynamic function. This is why nothing is referred to as a "body kit"!

My goal with my 911 was to build the best-looking street going track car I could, which in a world with smaller aftermarket support, I ended up giving it a GT3 look. While attending as many car meets and events as possible in Michigan, I met Noah Hudson-Perata, a local photographer/social media influencer. His car, "Sally", was the only 996 generation 911 that I have seen around with "aero". It was great to see another car similar to mine. A baby brother perhaps as this 996 is a .1 generation while mine is a .2 generation with the Turbo facelift that came in 2003. With us lusting over the GT3 that we all would love to own; we truly admire the 996 generation 911 and love our cars for what they are.

This photoshoot was done to reflect that. Tina, the name of my car, and Sally in their beautiful silver paint and "unique" headlights are just asking the world for their acceptance. They know they have a place in the 911 line up and just need more people to realize it. They are true Porsches that as of late, have aged very well. We truly appreciate this world and all the people we have met thus far. Enjoy these photos and don't be afraid to reach out.

We love meeting new people, talking cars and sharing our story of our, "pair of Aeros".


