





For the 2024 Fall Color Tour we tried something different. We usually have a two segment drive with a cider and donut stop in the middle and a dinner at the end. 

Haptics is the study and application of perceptions of usage of products and user interfaces. It involves the appearance, feel, feedback and even the sounds produced that convey effectiveness, efficiency and even quality. Not surprisingly this has everything to do with our automobiles. Just think

of all the touch points in our Porsches or any other automobile we use. What we perceive of as value and quality has everything to do with the haptic elements that are embedded in automotive design of every switch, knob, rocker switch, and other controls from door handle to pedals. Considering how sophisticated cars have become and how many features and user interfaces have evolved, the role of haptics has grown




We can begin with door design since that is the first haptic experience when we approach the car and the last as we leave it. The first touch is the door release and whether it is a button, a trigger or the entire handle, all have been options over the generations. The very latest approach is an electronic button. Whatever is fitted should have a solid,

but smooth touch and preferably be acknowledged with a sound with feedback that a mechanism has been affected. The door should release from the door jamb smoothly, but not swing open. The door swing motion needs to have one or two detent positions and open far enough to give full

access to the interior with a reasonable distance to clear other surroundings. Scissor doors may seem sexy, but the inconvenience overcomes the fashion statement. Likewise door sills that require acrobatic contortions or doors that require a wide swing angle look sexy, but are inconvenient. The door needs to have rubber gaskets that release smoothly while they perform the function of weather protection and wind and sound insulation. Likewise they serve an important function of providing an easy closing action that

secures the door in one motion. The door needs to have the feel of a hefty bank vault door without the penalty of actual bulk or weight. All of this haptic detail and we haven't even sat in the car yet.

The real design details involve driver involvement with the myriad of knobs, switches, rockers, slides, gages and now most importantly the display screens. Beginning with the door panels there are various release levers to open the door which are critical for placement, action, material and yes even color. For the driver, the placement and operation of the window controls needs to be easily reached and intuitive to operate. Will the window have an express up and down function or have a detent to overcome as well as regulating speed of action and partial action to stop and start motion? This is often accompanied by seat adjustment controls often taking the shape of a seat back and a set bottom that also can control seat height. Features such as seat heating and vibration are usually housed elsewhere. Lastly are the outside mirror controls which separate the actual mirror motion for the right and left sides. The feel and motion of all of these controls have to provide tactile feedback as they are usually performed by feel and not sight.



this case, there are haptic decisions as to what functions have priority and what can be handled by default setting or other customized drive settings. The same goes for the recent trend of long rows of rocker switches. The arrangement of these switches as well as their order and feel become critical to smooth operation as well as their feedback such as sound or lighting, especially at night. The steering wheel is its own area of haptic controls and what should and should not be located in the hub.

Added together it is easy to see how haptic design impacts the impressions of value and quality of our cars. To us it is just an overall impression, but it is truly made up of almost infinite amounts of design decisions.



#### **Street Survival School Student Perspective**

This course was amazing for many reasons, but honestly the best part was just how much fun it was to participate in!

I enjoyed the various courses and the instructors were all very nice and supportive. My favorite course was the skid pad because it was very fast and I could feel myself pushing the limits on my car. The other courses were also exciting and very educational. In general, it gave me an idea of what kinds of moves a car could make; where my car could fit and where it would end up running a cone over; and how just the smallest inputs can make huge differences in fast-paced situations.

In the weeks since I participated in this course, I have realized just how important these kinds of lessons are when driving on the road. I live in an area where it is common for squirrels, birds, or even deer to cross the road at inopportune times and just having the internal knowledge that I would know what to do in a situation where I would need to evade them is very comforting. Rapid lane changes or get off the road changes, are practiced extensively during this course and it gives me peace of mind to know how to do these in case of emergency.

For those who believe they don't need this course because you already passed your driving test: don't kid yourself. Just because you passed Drivers Ed doesn't mean you know all about how to drive your car. Drivers Ed is the bare minimum, and when it comes down to the safety and security of yourself and those around you, I wouldn't recommend settling for the bare minimum. It is a small time commitment and a huge benefit. The roads will never be safe as long as drivers with the bare minimum of training are using them, so don't put your life on the line for nothing.

I would recommend this course to anyone who drives regularly, especially in places with variable road conditions and fast-moving traffic, which is basically everywhere. I felt very welcome at this event: surrounded by people in my age group and encouraged by instructors who are passionate about what they do and experts in driving and automotive engineering. My one critique is that not enough people know about this gem! So sign up, tell your friends and spread the word. Maybe one day they could even open up this kind of training to all eligible drivers, not just teens, because we all know some adults are just as bad at driving as we are.

#### **Street Survival School Student Perspective**

I recently participated in Street Survival School at M1 Concourse and had an amazing experience. It not only prepared me, but educated me on the real life scenarios that could happen when driving a car. My dad signed me up a couple months prior and I assured him I didn't need the class, but after taking the class I am very glad I did. Having the resources of multiple educated and trained instructors gave me different insight and perspective, to help me understand more about my car. Each instructor had different methods and ways to help every driver, which made me feel safe while performing each exercise. Whether I was in class or doing interactive activities, I felt I was gaining so much knowledge. Throughout the day, I got to check my own tire pressure and even experience firsthand ABS taking control of my car. Some other things I learned were what understeering and oversteering is, which I got to experience and learn how to control. My favorite activity was the autocross portion of the training, which left me with more confidence on the road. Overall, I highly recommend any new driver take Street Survival School training.




#### Tom Walton Tribute

Porsche Club of America. It's The People, right? Well, we recently lost a good one with the passing of long-time SEM member Tom Walton on October 8th.

Tom grew up in Michigan and he had an interesting life. From going to school at Cranbrook as a young man, to successful oil speculation in Texas and bird hunting all over the United States and South America. You know you are travelling to exotic places when your hunting trip gets diverted due to a military coup. He married Linda, the love of his life 60 years ago. They met on a blind date, and on their second date Tom informed her that he intended to marry her. She thought he was nuts. Many of the Porsche cars Tom bought were really for Linda, as an expression of his love for her.

Like many of us, Tom was a car guy early in life. His automotive resume includes Mustangs and Corvettes and even a Lincoln Town Car with Police Interceptor underpinnings, and the whitest Rolls Royce Silver Shadow that ever rolled in Oakland County. Hitting a well in Texas led to an opportunity for self-reward and that materialized as a new Porsche 944. After that initial exposure to Porsche cars and an appreciation for the engineering that goes into these vehicles, Tom was hooked. Tom and Linda joined the Porsche Club in 1996, at about the time they acquired a 993 4S. Possibly the first Boxster S delivered in Michigan followed and Tom loved to drive that car all around Elk Rapids. But Tom's favorite car was his "little car", a Polo Red 1969 Porsche 912 which he acquired from Chuck Stoddard's personal collection. As the story goes, Tom fell in love with the car on an informal SEM trip to Chuck's garage and he pursued its acquisition for a couple years with everything from Christmas cards to Valentines, flowers and chocolates until Chuck agreed to sell it to him.



I first had an opportunity to spend time with Tom when SEM was hosting the annual "Roar On The Shore" Porsche Club Race at GingerMan Raceway. Within a minute of engaging in your first conversation with Tom, you would believe you had known him for years. I always enjoyed Tom's conversational energy and enthusiasm as he would speak expertly on any number of topics from automobiles to metallurgy to shotguns.

Tom loved the Porsche Club Racing scene. The built cars, the noise and the smells. And, as it turned out, Red Bull energy drinks. He could be seen in an orange vest with a walkie talkie and a Red Bull helping to make things happen. But he didn't actually drive the track. The closest thing to that might have been when Tom and Linda did the Tail of the Dragon. Should you not be familiar

with the Dragon, it is an awesome stretch of road in the Great Smokey Mountains with 318 turns over 11 miles. It is a destination, a mecca of sorts for crotch rockets, Harleys and all manner of sports and performance cars capable of handling the tight turns at speed. But when Tom drove the Tail of the Dragon, he did it in a motorhome – not at speed. He was not a popular guy that day! For the record, it was not intentional. You might be familiar with how easy it can be to find yourself in the wrong place with an RV and Tom's legendary drive started just that way. It was hilarious to hear him tell the story.

Tom was one of The People. He made going to a PCA event even more enjoyable. He loved his family, his cars and life and he was happy to tell you all about it. We loved his stories and those of us fortunate to know him are going to miss all of that. Rest in peace Porsche Friend.




