

### Munk's Tech Session



Spring is one of the most vibrant times of year, the flowers blooming, the trees budding and the sound of hibernating Porsches roaring back to life. The Porsche Tech Session at Munk's Motors is one of the first events every spring, Attendees are eager to get their cars out and enjoy the camaraderie of being able to gather together. The theme of this year's spring tech session was technical inspections for the track. This was an amazing opportunity to take a deep dive into what a safe vehicle looks like; even an owner who isn't planning on tracking his or her vehicle would learn a great deal about what might be involved in a comprehensive safety inspection. In addition, lunch and refreshments were provided and the sense of community was second to none.

The PCA High Performance Driver Education (HPDE) program has an excellent safety record. One factor making this record possible is the stringent requirements regarding vehicle technical inspections. This comprehensive inspection is required to be completed by a state-licensed automotive technician within 60 days of a PCA on-track event. While any state technician can perform such an inspection, it is strongly advisable to have the inspection completed by an enthusiast-focused shop such as Munk's Motors. These establishments know your specific Porsche and can pay close attention to potentially problematic areas: coolant pipes on a 996 turbo or seized brake caliper hardware on a 928, just to name a few.



background; of particular interest, the broomstick rule for open-top vehicles (look this one up!), as well as different types of helmets, roll bar padding requirements, and the HANS device. Merritt also shared several insightful stories from races in her Porsche 924. Rounding out the group, SEM Driver Education (DE) Chair, Steve Carbary, offered specific details on the structure and flow of DE events as well as clarification of specific PCA and SEM rules and guidelines for the DE events.

After lunch and after finishing discussing the items on the SEM tech inspection form, it was time to move to the interactive and hands-on part of the day. Munk's techs Rick and Evan, each took on the inspection of two Caymans






volunteered by owners eager to complete their first tech inspection of the season. The attendees got to observe every step of the thorough inspection in real time. Each car was owned by an SEM member: a gray 2014 981 Cayman and a black 2011 987 Cayman R. Both cars passed the tech inspections, with some wear and tear items noted as suggestions for future work. These cars are now ready for a DE event occurring in the next 60 days, including the first SEM DE on May 30th.

Driving past the big red and blue wrench and out of the parking lot, headed for fun and twisty roads ahead, I reflected on the wonderful community that is PCA. A community so willing to share knowledge and expertise, as we enjoy the cars and the people!



### Battery Life

There has been a lot written lately concerning battery life, but it is all about the battery life of electric vehicles rather than conventional car batteries. How many miles an electric vehicle (EV) can go between charges takes precedent over how many charging cycles occur over the life of a battery pack. The general rule of thumb is the battery life is related to the warranty period. That would be 8 to 10 years or roughly 150,000 miles. Since most of the EVs currently on the road are now approaching these numbers it becomes very relevant to contemplate battery replacement and the costs associated with that service. Accounts of EV cars being scrapped because the replacement cost exceeds the worth of the car are well documented. I have heard the cost of replacing a Tesla battery pack approaches \$26,000. Traditional car batteries have warranties of 3 to 5 years and replacement costs of \$150 to \$350 dollars. That becomes more of a routine maintenance item. I just went through battery replacement on two of my cars. It always comes as an unplanned shock because you just don't keep track of the age of batteries. In one case it was because of several months of inactivity and in the other case it was a trickle charger that had become unplugged. The common cause was a battery that had become totally discharged beyond restoring.

Battery life depends on maintenance and service factors such as recharging, load usage and even temperature. The same applies to their EV battery brothers. The primary job of traditional car batteries is to power the starter motor. Depending on things such as the torque applied by the starter and even the displacement and compression ratio of the motor can cause a heavy draw of power from the battery. Combine this with issues such as ambient temperature and tune of the engine and it can be a recipe for starting problems. Once the engine has started there may be other battery loads from ancillary features, especially operating computers or even theft alarms and keyless operating. If the voltage drops below the minimum operating volts the engine may shut down. That is why a voltmeter can provide critical operating data. A key operating requirement is the condition of battery connections and even the condition of the battery cables themselves. Over time corrosion can build up that raises the resistance of these connections and prevents the flow of current. Allowing the electrolyte level inside the battery to boil off reduces current flow and can short out the lead plates and cause battery failure. The creation of gel electrolyte, which is the addition of silica to the electrolyte solution, has resulted in maintenance free batteries and has greatly increased their life. The lithium-ion battery doesn't have electrolyte but does have coolant because electric flow creates heat, and uncontrolled heat will shorten the life of the battery. Innovations in EV battery

packs such as nickel-metal hydride promise possibilities for more energy storage and longer battery life. Solid state batteries such as lithium-sulfur may revolutionize future battery technology. Until then, the best way to extend the life of the EV battery requires managing the heat environment both hot and cold and limiting usage such as hard acceleration which requires high energy draw and accessories operation plus avoiding long periods of stop and go traffic.

But, where did battery usage begin? Batteries began in 1800 with Alessandro Volta's wet cell voltaic pile battery and with Gaston Plante in 1939 and the first lead-acid storage cell. Lithiumion batteries did not come along until Sony invented them in 1991. In 1901, the French made Tievey electric car took to the streets of Paris. Popularity grew as the gas-powered cars were noisy, smelly and difficult to hand crank start. Through the early 1900s, steam powered and electric cars far outnumbered gas-powered cars by over two to one and were commonly used as taxis. Cars such as the 1908 Studebaker electric outperformed their gas-powered rivals. Even Henry Ford's wife Clara had her favorite 1908 electric, no doubt to Henry's chagrin, and she had a 1914 Detroit Electric Model 47 Brougham even after Henry gave her a special Ford Model C with a child seat. Other notable electric car owners were Thomas Edison, Charles Steinmetz, Mamie Eisenhower, and even John D. Rockefeller, who owned two. The Detroit Electric was produced by the Anderson Electric Car company in Detroit and built 13,000 electric cars from 1907 to 1939. They were available with the Edison option which was a nickel-iron versus the standard lead-acid battery. Range was a reliable 80 miles with a top speed of 20 MPH, which was a normal speed even for gas powered cars. But, running expenses plus a lack of recharging stations reduced interest. The option of even renting an electric car by the day could not save the company. Detroit Electric Holding Ltd. lives on thanks to Albert Lam in the Netherlands. The invention of the electric starter as well as the dramatically reduced price of massproduced gas-powered cars spelled the end of the electric car era.

Environmental laws brought a revival of the electric as car companies had to commit to producing a portion of their cars as all electric. GM took up the challenge in 1996 with their EV1, but with a monetary loss on every car produced plus warranty and maintenance concerns caused GM to discontinue the lease program and scrap every car except for a few in private collections or museums. That leads us to today with a growing fleet of electric car options. But we are still facing the original problems of range, battery life and limited charging stations that impacted the original electric car.



I became a member of the SEM PCA in July of 2016 after the purchase of my first Porsche; a Guards Red 1984 Carrera 911 Cabriolet.

As I looked into the history of the Porsche car company and the Porsche legacy I found that not only does the car company have a rich history in designing and developing sports cars with the 911 placing fifth in the "Car of the Century" rankings in 1999, but the founder of the company Ferdinand Porsche was also an automotive engineer and originally involved in heavy tank design.

I found this intriguing as I have been involved in design and development of military hardware for over 30 years and involved with military land vehicles for the past 14 years.


### Ferdinand Porsche and his Military Vehicle History

The development of a new heavy tank design, the Tiger tank, had been initiated in 1937, in Germany, with an initial tank design contract awarded to a fellow by the name of Henschel. Soon after, another design contract followed in 1939 and was given to Ferdinand Porsche.

Henschel's Tiger tank development was based on the previous VK 30.01(H) and VK 36.01(H) prototype designs, while Porsche's Tiger development was based on the previous VK 30.01(P) or Leopard prototype tank design.

Porsche was also involved in competing for the early Tiger tank turret design. The initial design used on the tank is often misleadingly called the "Porsche" turret due to the belief that it was designed by Porsche for the Tiger prototype; in fact it was the initial Krupp design that was used in the prototypes.

Both prototype series vehicles used the same turret design from Krupp; the main differences were in the hull, transmission, suspension and automotive features. The Henschel design had its turret more-or-less centrally located on its hull, while the Porsche design placed the turret much closer to the front of the superstructure.

Porsche manufactured about 100 chassis for their proposal for the Tiger tank, the "Porsche Tiger", in the Nibelungenwerk factory in Sankt Valentin, Austria.

When the competing Henschel Tiger design was chosen for production, due to the complex nature of the Porsche drive system, the Porsche chassis were no longer required for the Tiger tank project.

It was therefore decided that the Porsche chassis were to be used as the basis of a new heavy tank destroyer. Ninety chassis that Porsche had already built for the Tiger tank competition were converted into self-propelled anti-tank guns; these were put into service in 1943 as the Panzerjäger Tiger (P) and known by the nickname "Ferdinand".

The Ferdinand mounted Krupp's newly developed 88 mm (3.5 in) anti-tank gun. This precise long-range weapon was intended to destroy enemy tanks before they came within their own range of effective fire.

In 1944 after modification of the existing vehicles, the Ferdinands were renamed Elefant. The Elefant tank destroyer had six road wheels per side mounted in paired bogies sprung with short longitudinal torsion bars that were integral to the wheel pair; this saved internal space and facilitated repairs.

The Elefant had a kill ratio of nearly 10:1, but as with most German wartime vehicles, lack of supplies made maintenance a serious problem, reducing the effectiveness of the vehicles.

The most common reason for Elefant vehicle losses during World War II was because the vehicles became stuck or broke down, and so the crews often had to destroy their own vehicles to avoid them being captured.

Only two Elefants survived the war; one is in a museum in the US and the other one is in a museum in Moscow.

The M1A2 Abrams Tank pictured below with my 1984 Carrera Cabriolet is one of the greatest military land vehicle fighting machines in the world.

The M1A2 weighs approximately 70 tons and is powered by a Honeywell multi-fuel turbine engine. The M1A2's firepower comes from a 120mm smoothbore gun supported by a 50-caliber heavy machine gun secondary weapon. The M1A2 is designed to help the US and its allies provide a strong defense to world challenges.







### Around the Zone

### HPDE-Try it. You'll like it!

PCA offers its members a broad array of opportunities to enjoy their fellow members and their cars. One of the most beneficial opportunities is offered to the teenagers of PCA and their colleagues through our recent affiliation with Tire Rack Street Survival. The statistics are impressive; some 80% of Street Survival participants are involved in NO driving incidents before their 25th birthday. However, most of us, the older persons and parents of those teenagers did not have Street Survival available to us. I dare say that many of us could use a heads-up on our driving skills. Thankfully, PCA is developing an adult car control program, but that is not here yet. Nevertheless, PCA has offered an adult car control clinic for many years; we call it High Performance Driver Education and I personally believe everyone who owns a Porsche (or any other car) should participate in HPDE. I understand that you do not want to risk damage to the jewel in the garage and I can try to convince you that there is very little risk in our HPDE program, which is true. I know it won't work for all of you. All Porsches were designed and built to be track-ready, so the car is ready, but you could buy an old Boxster to use on track or an old BMW or Miata. Why am I so convinced HPDE is a good thing?

1. You have an opportunity to experience the behavior of your car under conditions that would get you arrested on public streets. Those conditions inform you of the "operating envelope" of your car: braking, acceleration, turning. On city streets, rural roads, or interstates, there will come a time when you must avoid or crash. Knowing that your car handles well enough to avoid and developing some of the instinct to avoid comes from HPDE.

- 2. Seeing what's coming is important. Looking ahead as far as you possibly can, looking behind using all your mirrors regularly and keeping track of the other vehicles on the road are critical to keeping a safe distance between you and those other vehicles. Situational awareness, separation, and planning help avoid incidents. We teach those skills in HPDE.
- 3. As a driver, being predictable for the other drivers on the road helps avoid the awkward moments when coming together can happen. Developing a pattern of assessment, decision, and execution is fundamental to what we do on the HPDE track.
- 4. As an extension of Point 1 above, driving on a wet (or snowy?) track provides a safer opportunityto develop your car-handling skills in those inclement conditions that we experience regularly. You learn the feel of the car as its grip on the pavement is lessened and you learn how to respond to keep the car under control. One of the exercises in Street Survival is a friction circle; students feel the loss of grip and they learn appropriate responses. HPDE does that too.

I could go on, of course, but HPDE is not JUST a recruiting program for PCA Club Race. Maybe you will become addicted to the feel of the track and you will consider Club Race, but my personal addiction for HPDE is learning more about myself as a driver and about my car as the driven.
