Tool Bags







Every Porsche comes equipped with a very nicely appointed set of tools in a rather elegant tool bag of black vinyl either in smooth finish or waffle weave. If you do not have this bag you can thank the scum bag of a previous owner who absconded with it as a memento. You have to admire the faith Porsche has in its owners to think that very basic hand tools can rescue you from a side of the road break down.

The tools in the bag can vary depending on the model. The 911 bag usually contains the following tools: Two Allen wrenches, one tow hook, one set of five double ended open wrenches, one pair of pliers, one slotted and one Phillips screwdriver, one spark plug socket and matching wrench, one lug nut wrench, one pin drive pulley wrench and one spare fan belt. Slightly more specific tool sets were fitted to various models such as the 928, 944 and so on. Also included was a package of fuses of various sizes and the infamous tube type jack, plus an air pump if the car had an inflatable spare. All of these tools and even complete tool bags are available OEM or used but they do not come cheap. A single open-end wrench can be \$17 while a complete tool bag is \$599 and the very basic looking jack is \$324. You can easily buy 100-piece tool sets in a molded tool carry box for \$100 at any parts store. An OEM Ford scissors jack sells for \$50. Other German cars like Mercedes and BMW have their own versions of tool sets, but not like the Porsche.

I don't claim any special mechanical talent, but I cannot imagine what kind of repair I could accomplish with a Porsche tool set. I think it might take the creativity of a MacGyver to accomplish any roadside repair. Although I can brag that I was able to change the 944 collapsible spare tire on the side of the road using the factory tools. I also have changed spark plugs with the factory spark plug socket and matching Allen wrench. Contrast that with any American car and you are lucky if it came with a spare tire and jack and nothing else. I learned from my father to make up my own emergency tool bag which I still carry in each of my cars. I find that a pair of screwdrivers, an adjustable wrench, a small flashlight and a Leatherman, plus a Swiss Army knife should prepare me for most emergencies.

Fortunately, most modern cars are very reliable. Don't expect to get much assistance from the owner's manual either. Although it often has useful advice on having your car towed to a repair shop in an emergency, repair advice is usually limited to routine service and advice on when to visit the dealer. With the electronics of

the modern car it is unreasonable to offer any emergency tools or repair advice. I can't even offer any advice on spare parts you might need in an emergency.

The best advice might be to not touch anything if the repair is not obvious. Of course, I do have a couple of stories about very odd breakdowns I managed to solve on the side of the road. The first one involved my 1964 356C coupe. It would be driving just fine and then the engine would simply quit. There was lots of head scratching trying to decipher the last thing that could have happened. For some reason I deduced it had to be the ignition. Taking off the distributor cap I notice the distributor points were not opening. After twisting the rotor the points aligned themselves and off I went. My mechanic did the real diagnostic sorting and found that the distributor shaft had worn oblong, causing the points to not open on the distributor cam. The problem was solved by replacing the distributor with a new one. The other side of the road break down happened with my 911. I took a work trip to Cleveland with my friend Heath Hurlbert. On the way home we stopped by Stoddard Porsche in Willoughby. Heath bought some odd 356 part and I bought an "S" distributor rotor because it had a 7,200 RPM cutout as opposed to the stock 6,700 RPM one in my "E" model. On the way home we were charging up a hill, over some slight bumps, when the motor suddenly went silent. Pulling onto the shoulder we noted there was a local audience watching us on a nearby house porch. Both of us peered into the engine compartment hoping for a miracle. Then I noticed that the distributor cap had popped loose. With it fastened back in place, we climbed into the car but the engine would not fire. Looking back under the hood nothing was obvious, but it had to be electrical. Testing every connector yielded no clues, but the distributor cap had come loose again. After refastening the cap again we piled back into the car sure that it was cured. With still no fire from the engine, our local audience began to laugh and point. This time I looked closer at the cap and discovered that the rotor had jumped off the shaft and sheared the drive key inside the rotor. Normally we would have been DOA, but I remembered the rotor I had just bought. Fitting the new part with total confidence, we one more time closed the lid, climbed back in the car, fired it up and drove home justified but humble. Who keeps a spare rotor in their luggage?

The point is that sometimes the best tools in the world can't save the situation. But, also cherish your tool bag and don't be that guy that takes it as a keepsake.

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





The Porsche Club of America, through its various zones and regions, hosts events labeled as High Performance Driver Education. Your Southeast Michigan region typically hosts four of these events every year. But what exactly are these and how do they involve members? To help answer that and a variety of other questions or perhaps concerns, we held our annual DE-101 on May 17th at the Waterford Hills Road Racing Course. It's a great way to kick off the season and introduce members to what could become their favorite way to spend a day driving their Porsche.


Trying any new experience can be intimidating though. Especially one that involves a prized sports car combined with a race course. The amount of unknowns in that combination can seem overwhelming to just about anyone. Those of us on the DE Team completely understand this feeling as we have all been there ourselves. This is the reason for our DE-101 event, to open the first door and offer a look inside at all that a High Performance Driver Education event has to offer.

A small group joined me on a brisk spring morning in the track tower 'press room'. Here we gathered for a short presentation and open discussion about our Driver Education program, often referred to as DE. I had a chance to cover what some one can expect when attending one of the events and what it takes to get ready. How to prepare your car as well as yourself, how the day runs, and procedures we follow for safety and fun at speed. Our Drivers Education days are broken up between times when students take their cars on the track with their instructors and periods when we have classroom sessions. These classroom sessions allow us the chance to discuss the concepts of car dynamics and driving techniques. We break down terms like understeer and rotation, weight transfer and threshold braking in further detail. The class sessions reinforce what students are putting to practical use during the driving sessions. We feel this dual approach is extremely beneficial and separates us from just 'open track' days.

Who are High Performance Driver Education events for, those wanting to race?

High Performance Driver Education events are for anyone who would like to enjoy driving at a higher level of performance than what can safely be done on the streets. Our cars are capable of so much more than what the average driver can usually perceive. While higher levels of car control and performance techniques are a part of racing, these principals do have real day-to-day applications. I would say more than you would think. Let's face it, driving is a learned skill. We've all had our basic drivers training when we got our state license. But think about how much your driving has improved since then. Years of practice in a range of situations and conditions has been your teacher since those early years. The same applies to driving cars as you approach the higher limits of their capabilities. Further education, practice, and coaching is how anyone improves at any skill. HPDE events are a great opportunity to do just this. I also frequently point out that I feel the skills I have gained over the years at these events have saved myself as well as those around me on at least three occasions in everyday driving. I have heard this time and time again from others involved as well. So I would say HPDE events are for anyone looking to enjoy their car and their friends, both the new ones you may make as well as old ones. Plus, those looking to have a better understanding of driving and enjoy the skill of driving, not just operating an automobile. And come on we bought sports cars for a reason, bring it out to the track ©.
