The day began, as always, with a flurry of activity and there was much to do to get the day started. Cars being prepped, registration paperwork to be completed, and several newbies renting helmets. Before long it was time for the drivers meeting. This is required at every Drivers Education event and it gives our Chief Instructor, Marc Molzon, the opportunity to share very important details for the day. Details that include things like safety procedures and track directions, but also instructor introductions and taking a moment to thank our sponsors. From there each group takes its turn on the track or in the classroom. The Waterford Hills facility is an exciting road course and right in our own backyard for many of us (so to speak). This course is rather short for a race track at a mere 1.6 miles, but has many challenging turns and a fair amount of elevation changes! This track is always ready to provide an ultimate driving experience. It is often said that if you can drive well at Waterford, you can handle anything other tracks may throw at you. But for May 30th, it was soon filled with various Porsches running through the gears and flexing their suspensions, delighting the drivers and those waiting for their chance at the curves.

After a few morning sessions, we had a brief pause for lunch. During this time, I had a moment to talk to a 'first timer' and ask if this was as much fun as promised. He expressed how

he now understood that these types of events are really the only place to experience what a car like his Cayman is truly capable of. "The 'road', the coaching, the atmosphere and the people, you just can't enjoy this type of driving anywhere else." I think we may have found another long term friend - haha. Welcome to your new favorite hobby! "We've all been exactly where you are at", I told him. I loved seeing his excitement. Moments like this make organizing these days all worth it for the DE Team.





Sometimes you get lucky with the weather for an outdoor event. And sometimes you don't.

7:20am, Saturday, June 21 – SEM Solstice Tour I hear what sounds like the rumble of thunder. A couple minutes later, I hear it again. A few minutes later, the rain comes cascading down.

8:00am

Diagnostics







Diagnostics have always played a role in automotive repair and maintenance, but the meaning has changed greatly as cars have evolved from being mechanically to electronically based. With this evolution have also come revised training methods and tools. Since the dawn of the automotive age, a mechanics best skill was his ability to diagnose and solve mechanical problems. A sound understanding of mechanical principals was essential, as well as deductive logic, to understand a problem or failure and resolve it with the necessary tools. As automotive engineering progressed and evolved from mechanical to the electronic, those skills, tools and methods have changed significantly requiring new training techniques to go along with them. This has become very evident in the workshop manuals produced by the manufacturers.

My father introduced me to the usefulness of owning a factory produced workshop manual. He would order whatever was the current manual for the car he owned and always referenced them for resolving problems as well as performing routine tasks. When I purchased my first 914/6, I purchased my first set of Porsche manuals for that model. They came as a set of several binders covering mechanical, body and electrical topics. When I bought my 911, I found many of the subjects were covered in the manuals I already owned and any gaps could be filled by internet sources. The biggest problem was not owning the specialized tools that were necessary, plus not possessing the factory training to carry out those repairs effectively or properly diagnose the source of the problem. If I could not find the factory manuals for my Sirocco, Integra, or Mazda, I was able to resolve that gap with Haynes manuals. Very useful were the step by step pictures and action plans. Also useful were the diagnostic steps to recognize and resolve problems. But, as I progressed to newer model cars the detail of diagnostics shifted from mechanical steps to very elaborate electronic tests and tools to resolve body, engine management and operating computer issues. A selection of tools was replaced or supplemented by computer diagnostic tools, including very sophisticated factory service computers often directly connected to the manufacturers operating network through the internet. These computers were purchased from the manufacturer at great cost and only available to dealers and with factory training. Not only did this cut out the home mechanic, but even the private mechanic as well.

Now we have entered the age of the electric car and powertrain they might as well come with signs that say no serviceable parts or modules are contained here. Today's cars are driven by multiple

computers which interact with each other such that a failure in one can drive a failure in a totally unrelated component in an almost random sequence. The programs themselves are comprised of thousands of lines of computer code. When a computer program fails, it may be impossible to replicate. Often the only diagnostic solution is to swap out a computer module and see if the problem reoccurs or generates a diagnostic code that narrows down the error. To save wiring and modules, many functions share sections of components in a process called a bus or multi-function circuit. With the modern circuitry and computers, many diagnostics issues can be resolved by so called re-flashing the computer. A technician can connect a car to the service diagnostics tool at the dealer, and through an internet connection to the factory service center, send a new computer program to override the faulty program in the vehicle's computer. There are even some predictions that future cars will self-diagnose and self-connect with factory computer networks. With the rapid advances in artificial intelligence we could see the day when the car computer can not only self-diagnose, but self-correct computer problems.

The solution to an electrical problem can often frustrate even the most talented and trained technician. When my 1972 911 was still new, it had an awful periodic engine failure that totally baffled the dealer. At an almost random occurrence, the motor would guit while running with no warning. It would restart after a few minutes only to quit again with no warning. The dealer assigned a mechanic who had just received the latest training in engine electronics. He surmised it was ignition related and isolated it to the capacitive discharge (CD) box, a supposedly fail proof component used in every six cylinder engine. These boxes were usually manufactured by Bosch, but in 1973 Porsche changed to CD unit from Permetex who also supplied aircraft. In my mind the solution was to exchange my Bosch unit to one from Permetex. The dealer said the part was so new it wasn't stocked. My logic was that if there was no difference, they could just pull a Permetex from one of the newer 911s and swap it with mine. With the swap done, my problem was solved. After that I never used Bosch units and went with Permetex exclusively, even to the point of using two boxes on my dual ignition engines.

Diagnostics may have changed to keep up with new engineering, but the solution still requires the right tools and trained service person to keep our new cars running.




