





Some fifty years ago, I was fortunate to be the head of Porsche and Audi Public Relations at Volkswagen of America. As the PR Chief, I had to plan and execute the annual launch of the new model year cars from both manufacturers. Quite a juggling act.

On a trip to Stuttgart in 1974, I was briefed on the global plans to launch the 1975 Porsche Turbo and I had the chance to drive a prototype on the track at Weissach. What a thrilling opportunity! During that trip, I had to order two Porsche Turbos for the press launch in the U.S. So, I ordered silver with red leather and dark green with tan leather versions. These Turbos were the first production cars to arrive in the country.

For the North American press launch, I chose the Ohio Transportation Research Center, now the Honda Test Center, for our initial press introduction. TRC had a seven-

mile-high speed oval which we used to test the top speed of the Turbos. Our guest drivers for the event were Al Holbert and Peter Greg who demonstrated the capabilities of the cars on the track. We were very conscious of the car's potential severe oversteer, so we initially limited the media drive to the high-speed oval and to a short autocross set up on the massive skid pad at TRC. Of course, later on the media took the cars on various road courses for testing and some dubbed the Porsche Turbo "The Widow Maker", a moniker our attorneys despised.

Fifty years later my passion for Porsche continues. I always loved the first silver Porsche Turbo with red leather and today I own a silver Porsche 991.2 Turbo S with red leather and a silver Porsche 356 Speedster Tribute in Silver with red leather interior.

Still my favorite color combination.



Helmets

If you are going to get hooked on driving school events like I did, you are going to want to invest in your own helmet. If you are just getting started, our club does offer loaner helmets to students. This makes it very easy to participate without making the investment. You have to reserve the helmet before the event and it comes with a head balaclava so that you don't get the helmet sweaty. A selection of sizes is offered so it is most likely you will find one that fits. If you are a repeat student, even just a few times per year, owning your own helmet is a great investment. Not only are you guaranteed to have a helmet available, but finding the right fit will be guaranteed. It is also an opportunity to express your personality with just the right style of helmet and even a personalized decoration.

There are safety standards that apply to helmets, so be aware that you old motorcycle helmet will not be allowed. There is a safety standard put out by the SNELL Foundation that regulates which helmets are permitted for driving activities whether it is automobile, motorcycle or even karting. Part of technical inspection for our driving events is to verify that the helmet you intend to wear meets current safety or SNELL standards which is a year rating spelled out on an official SNELL year sticker affixed to the helmet.

William "Pete" Snell was an armature SCCA racer who died in a sports car race in 1956 due to an unsafe helmet. In 1957 his friends formed the nonprofit SNELL Foundation based in California to test and certify helmets. They test and certify some 3,000 helmets annually with new standards getting published every five years. The current rating is SA2020 which indicates it is for special applications (SA) including fire retardation interior padding. The motorcycle equivalent would be a M2020 rating which meets the same shell durability, but without the fire safety standard. Testing of the helmet shell involves dropping a steel weight from 9.8 feet without damaging the dummy head, assuring that the helmet remains secure to the dummy head without rolling off and if applicable that the interior fabric doesn't catch fire or melt. Current standards are SA2010, SA2015 and SA2020 with the SA2010 rating going to expire in 2024 and the SA2020 rating expiring in 2032. PCA and all race organizations require a SA2010 or SA2020 rating with some exceptions as approved by the organizer. Some exceptions have been made for M rated helmets based on the organizers discretion. Helmets come in both closed face, with an eye slot and face shield, and open face. Either is acceptable with the exception of closed face being required in an open cockpit application.

Helmets are secured by a fire proof nylon chin strap with a double "D" fastener or other secure clip. They also may

be fitted with HANS or head and neck restraint posts. PCA requires the use of HANS devices on vehicles equipped with roll cages. Interior padding must be fitted tight enough such that the helmet cannot be rocked side to side or front to back. Over a period of time this padding may compress or otherwise deteriorate, which would indicate time for replacement. Of course any accident that occurs would require replacement, but even a drop on to a hard surface could damage the shell and require replacement. The use of a helmet bag is strongly advised.


The shape of the helmet shell has specific design functions. One serious consideration is air flow venting at the nose and top of the shell for cooling as well as sweat reduction. Another less obvious feature is aero flaps on the nose and top of the shell. These aero shapes direct air flow and although it has no effect in a closed car, it is absolutely essential in an open formula car or racing kart to prevent the helmet lifting up and possibly restricting vision. I have experienced this effect and it is terrifying. The visor opening comes in many shapes and sizes and the visor itself is usually a 3mm thick polycarbonate, that can be clear or tinted, and it is fitted for removable tear off strips or treated for anti-fog condensation. They are also fitted with ratchet stops so that they can be held open at desired levels. In the closed position they should be dust proof.


Which brand of helmet you choose is entirely up to your taste and budget. My original helmet was a simple white closed face Bell made out of a relatively heavy fiberglass. A friend custom painted it in the colors of Emerson Fittipaldi, which happened to be German colors red and black. The next helmet was a carbon fiber Simpson with a large eye opening and a custom application of a striking flame and checkered flag design. I was sure it would be unique until I showed up at the first event of the season and my first student had an identical helmet! My next helmet was a black RaceQuip which I added red and gold stripes to. My last helmet was another black RaceQuip, but trimmed in gold and red pin striping. Stick on graphics kits are under \$10 for that customized look.

Some popular brands of helmets are the JLAN at \$227, Bell at \$157, Conquer at \$227 or Race Quip at \$203. Higher in the price range are the Arei starting around \$699, Simpson for \$699 and Shoei at \$599. If you want to go the full Formula One route there is the Stilo starting at around \$1,300 up to an eye watering \$4,100 all in unpainted carbon fiber just like their race cars. Choose wisely or as they say, pay what you think your head is worth. ■

Indiana Nurburgring Overnight Tour

Schweinefiletring, also known as the Indiana Nürburgring, is a 180 mile loop that is very similar in shape to the famous publicly accessible road in Germany called the Nürburgring. Schweinefiletring's most northern point is about an hour south of Indianapolis where the outstanding loop of Indiana roads starts. The Schweinefiletring gives you a bit of all of the greatest roads east of the Mississippi. If you've joined us on SEM PCA drives to the Triple Nickel or Tail of the Dragon you will quickly be harkened back to the driving pleasure you experienced there. The undulations feel reminiscent of the Triple Nickel and the tight and blind corners bring back part of the thrill of the Tail of the Dragon. The Schweinefiletring isn't just the greatest hits of those roads, it has its own thrill and beauty to explore.

The 2025 SEM PCA overnight trip to the Schweinefiletring started on Friday, August 1st in Ann Arbor. Twelve cars met at Zingerman's to caravan down to Columbus, IN. We also had Chris Randolph, a photographer from C.A.R. Visuals, traveling with us this year for the first time. The weather was great all weekend with sunshine and highs around 80°F. We stopped for lunch at a British Restaurant called Payne's in Gas City IN. The food was great and the large statue of Garfield was entertaining. We arrived at our hotel later in the afternoon. In what is now a tradition, we went to Texas Roadhouse for dinner as they seem to always be next to the Holiday Inns that we stay at.

On Saturday, August 2nd, eighteen cars gathered at 9 a.m. to start the Indiana Nürburgring. We divided into three groups to ensure a safe and fun event. The weather was

mostly cloudy in the morning that gave way to partly cloudy skies in the afternoon with a high of 80°F. After a very short drive through town, we were immediately out on the back roads. The first driving segment had us heading southwest on the east side of the ring.

The roads on the east side of the ring are like the 555/ Hocking Hills. This year was the first time we were able to run IN-135 S without interruption. Elevation changes with tight and also sweeping turns greeted us with great forest views. We skipped the Shoals Overlook this year and instead stopped at a Marathon gas station in Bedford, IN with more space and better amenities. After leaving our first stop we again headed southwest. US-50 gave us a nice break from the tighter twisties with very long elevation changing sweepers alongside the Martin State Forest. Unfortunately, the road surface was recently stripped and covered with loose gravel and this slowed our progress down a bit. We headed back northeast on IN-450 towards our lunch stop. The route is similar to the backroads around the Tail of the Dragon. As we continued on, the next stop was at the William Covered Bridge. Unfortunately, this year we were not able to do the photoshoot at the bridge. A large truck had parked in front of the bridge so we turned the group around and completed a short hop to lunch.

Our lunch stop was at Smokin Jim's BBQ. The reason the Schweinefiletring is promoted by the locals is to get you to stop at one of these BBQ joints. The food was once again excellent. Leaving the BBQ joint we headed northwest to complete the west side of the ring. The IN-43 soon turned tight and twisty with steep inclines and declines. At this


